Let's Talk Liturgics

Have you ever wondered why the church uses different colored decorations at various times of the year? These liturgical colors used by Christian churches have deep spiritual significance and symbolism. In this article, we will explore the meaning of each color. From Advent to Easter, Pentecost to Ordinary Time we will discover how these colors help express our faith and enrich our worship experience.

Traditionally the four liturgical colors are: purple, white, red, and green. Each color has its own meaning and importance in relation to the Christian calendar.

Purple: A color traditionally associated with a time of preparation and penitence; is often displayed during the seasons of Advent and Lent, although sometimes dark blue is used during Advent.

White: Symbolizes purity, joy, light, and glory and is used primarily during the seasons of Christmas and Easter and also on various other feast days throughout the Christian year, including baptisms and funerals.

Red: Represents blood, fire, and passion and is used to commemorate the arrival of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost, the sacrifice of the martyrs, and the fire of God's love. Red is traditionally used on the day of Pentecost, Reformation Sunday, and during Confirmation.

Green: Signifies a time of growth and renewal. The color green is often used to represent the season of Ordinary Time, a season that primarily focuses on the Lord's three-year public ministry, His teachings, and His miracles, as a reminder to the church of her mission.

While the use of colors during worship may seem like a trivial element, these colors play a significant role in helping us engage with the liturgy. As we worship not only with our minds but all our senses, colors can help to set the tone of a service and create an atmosphere of prayer and reflection. As we move through the different seasons in the church year, understanding the meaning behind each color ensures that our worship remains focused on God's Word and His promises.


