FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR PAUL

Let's Talk Liturgics

A man died and went to heaven. An angel showed him around and informed him that heaven is made up of many rooms in which are the various denominations. The angel took him down a hallway where the man heard beautiful choral singing. "Who's in that room?" the man asked. "Oh, those are the Episcopalians," the angel replied. The angel took the man a little further down the hallway and, all of a sudden, the man heard clapping and tambourine music. "These are the Pentecostals," the angel explained. After several more rooms, the angel took the man to the last room at the end of the hallway. The angel placed his finger over his mouth and warned the man to be very, very quiet. "Why?" the man asked. The angel answered, "Because this is the room with all the Baptists, and they think they're the only ones up here."

I'd like to say just a brief word about Holy Communion in this article. Each denomination has their own views concerning Communion, the nature and necessity of it. It has been my experience that churches with a low view of Communion, the idea that the bread and wine are only symbols and nothing more, tend to have a nonchalant attitude toward observing or celebrating Communion in worship. They typically only observe Communion a handful of times each year and then, when it is observed, it's usually tacked on to the very end of a worship service with very little, if any, preparation. This is what happens when churches fail to recognize the true nature and purpose of Holy Communion.

When Christ instituted this Sacred Meal, he took the bread and said, "This is my body." He took the cup and said, "This is my blood." Therefore, Jesus gives us His true body and blood in, with, and under the bread and wine for the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. When Communion is rightly/biblically understood as being much more than bread and wine, this not only changes our view of the nature and necessity of the Lord's Supper, but it also impacts how we approach the Lord's Table and how we receive the Sacrament of the Altar. A high view of Communion leads to high and reverent worship. Why? Because Jesus is truly present, and He gives Himself to us. He meets us at the rail, and He Communes with us there!

"When we bless the cup at the Lord's Table, aren't we sharing in the blood of Christ? And when we break the bread, aren't we sharing in the body of Christ? And though we are many, we all eat from one loaf of bread, showing that we are one body." 1Corinthians 10:16-17
