### Remember: Take small steps but always in the right direction.

After a lot of small steps we have come around to the beginning of my second year at St. Paul's. For me it has been a joy to travel through time with you all. Seeking God's will by living together and seeking God's word in the mercy of Jesus our Lord is a step. Praying together, constantly and persistently is always the first step of faith. Continue taking the first step every day as long as it is called today. Listen for the voice of Jesus saying "Follow Me!" Test what you think you hear against the words of Jesus that are actually recorded in your Bible! Jesus will not contradict himself by saying something to us that he did not say to his other disciples.

So, arriving at this place we remain confident that God is preparing us for our new pastor and God is preparing our new pastor for us. November has us walking through Reformation, All Saints, the end of the Pentecost season and the first Sunday of Advent. During the past year we've had friends and neighbors lead our worship because God gives gifts of leadership according to the needs of the congregation – and God is faithful among us.

November will begin to see others come and preach God's word among us beginning with Danny Cox on November 13. Others will be coming along after the new year arrives – but maybe sooner. First Sunday in Advent: Isaiah 2:1-5; Psalm 122; Romans 13:8-14; Matthew 24:36-44

Those are the lessons prescribed by the Lectionary. Maybe they will be modified for Sunday worship but they are worth reading to be prepared to listen for Jesus calling – so read to be prepared. Other small steps we've taken – St. Paul's hosted the 3:16 group and were blessed to have a house full of TriCenter middle schoolers to read and sing and talk and play. We will host 3:16 again! News from the annual LCMC national gathering is available on the LCMC website. Look it up and listen to the speakers. We may be using some of them at the 8:00 Bible Study on Sunday Morning. The Iowa District LCMC meeting is coming up on November 12. The path is prepared and God is faithful. Take small steps but always in the right direction.

I am writing this from a kitchen table in Ogre (pronounced oo-ag-rah) Latvia, just a short distance from my son, Ben and his family. I won't see you at worship this week but I'll b praying with and for you all. See you at worship in November!
