When you sit to solve the problems of the world I'm asking you to start close to home. Perhaps we will find that we have the will and the skill and the opportunity to do something which will indeed have a positive effect on the ministry of St. Paul's Lutheran!

This is a short thought (which is usually all I can handle) from the May news letter: **"Take small steps but always in the right direction."** keep it in mind as you read on.
