#### **August 2023 Meeting Minutes**

This is the meeting of St Paul's Lutheran Church held on Monday, August 14 th, 2023, in the basement of the church.

Council members present: Monte Bracker, Julie Jenson, Bill Bracker (by phone) Emily McKern, Mike Van Sickle, Ruben Valdez, and Pastor Joe Lambert. Also present were Charlie Narmi and Nancy Hedegaard

Not present: Rashelle Wohlers, Bob Gregory, and Steven Andersen

Monte, as President, conducted the meeting, and Pastor led those present in an opening prayer.

The previous month's minutes were reviewed. One correction was necessary regarding the proposed building cost. Upon correction, motion to approve by Ruben, seconded by Julie. Motion passed.

#### **Treasurer's Report:**

Charlie Narmi and Nancy Hedegaard were present to discuss the church finances. Charlie, with Baird, explained all three of the endowment accounts are managed the same, and Baird acts as a fiduciary on the church's behalf. All clients are treated the same, and their fee is one percent of the balance of the account. There is incentive to build the accounts because if it hits \$1 million the fee drops to .9 percent.

The accounts are heavy in equities, but Baird thinks they are very high quality equities. The current net return of the accounts is about 11 percent. Discussed money management with plans to take more money to pay for a full time pastor.

Nancy reported we keep going down a little bit every month and will need to have a plan for how to address. Pastor Pravin's request for support was discussed and whether we could afford an ongoing contribution. The Council felt this was an appropriate use of the outreach funds and can be used from that fund. Bob moved to send \$200 per month and Mike seconded the motion. The motion passed by voice vote.

#### Pastor's Report:

Pastor reported it's been an exciting month and good people are showing up. He is becoming more of an observer, helping to forge a pathway we've anticipated for a long time. He encouraged us to keep the attitude that we're all participants, especially was we welcome Pastor Widener.

Sound of Freedom—great showing, good attendance, and was a great community outreach project.
