MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING ST. PAUL'S LUTHERAN CHURCH 22163 SUMAC RD, NEOLA, IOWA 51559-5069 JANUARY 23, 2022

The 141st Annual Congregational Meeting of St. Paul's Lutheran Church was held in the church sanctuary following services on January 23, 2022, with 29 voting members present.

Josh Bracker, as president, conducted the meeting.

1. Determination of Quorum and Opening Devotions: Meeting was opened at 11:00 with a devotion and prayer led by Pastor Joe Lambert.

Pastor Joe thanked the congregation for welcoming him. He also spoke about his job as an interim and his role in helping the church with the call process.

6. Approval and discussion of 2022 Proposed Budget: Josh Bracker discussed that the council is coming up with a variety of ideas to save money. This is a topic due to the decrease in funds coming in through offerings. Bruce Bracker and Dale Stephens would like to encourage the congregation to increase their giving.

INTERIM PASTOR'S REPORT

Writing this report is a reminder of great and amazing things as well as things that seem rather sad. As your pastor for the past year I am primarily blessed to be a part of your community and your congregation. And as I have grown to know you so I have grown in the understanding of how God's love is expressed through the faithful lives of my brothers and sisters at St. Paul's Lutheran. It is good for me to be challenged in my faith and it is good for me to express my faith and see how it challenges you. The challenge, in the process of being both confused and enlightened, is always to keep our eyes focused on things above where Christ is and understand that His good and perfect will, being revealed in time, is being accomplished among us even before we perceive it. Simply amazing. Simply grace!

The sadness comes in the reality that my time is half gone. I participated in one funeral service and helped park cars for a couple of other graveside services this year. Gladly, hospitals and care centers are welcoming visitors again so I was able to visit for illness and surgeries several times this year. I am thankful that you have encouraged me to renew some connections with my friends in LCMC at both a state (Iowa) and international (that's what really happens) annual gathering. This has enabled me to make some connections with students and others seeking a pastoral call. Consequently we will be visited by guest speakers throughout the spring who are being trained in pastoral ministry.

The council continues to upgrade and slowly implement technology that will hopefully enhance services and allow us to reach people wherever they may be.

We are thankful to be once again having Sunday school. Thank you to those who stepped up to make that happen. I think it's safe to say that child and youth programs must be central in what we do here.
