Board of Directors' Corner

At the Board of Directors Meeting held on Thursday, March 27, three motions were unanimously passed. Two of these projects were pending and one is All three are for the start-up projects that come under the special assessment. They are as follows:

- Clubhouse Dance Floor. After searching over various products a vinyl flooring was selected and the contract approved from Father & Sons Carpet & Flooring for \$8,680.00. We hope to complete this project as soon as possible.
- The Exercise Room Elliptical console stopped working and since the equipment was in good condition a repair was in order for \$1,324.80. That work has been completed and the Elliptical is back in operation.
- 3. Clubhouse Decking repair: Contract was awarded to CARE Facility Mgmt. for \$17,500.00 and consists of replacing corroded supporting joist hangers & pipe clamps under the deck, 3 fascia boards, 1 rotted column and railing. There could be additional worked needed once they get under the deck. This project should be underway once the required permitted in completed.

Two of these projects were pending items and the deck work falls under the special assessment funding. Moving right along.

POOL DECK

As approved at the February Board Meeting, the pool deck area will be leveled by drilling holes in the surface where cracking & settling has occurred. They will be pumping a polyurethane under the surface to fill voids and stabilize the soil underneath.

This work is scheduled to begin tomorrow April 2 & 3 and the swimming pool area will be closed during the project.



DO NOT FEED RACCOONS

Please, do not <u>ever</u> feed raccoons, they are wild animals and carry many infectious diseases and pericytes that can affect your pets and even you! Raccoons are typically nocturnal animals but we are now seeing these raccoons throughout the day because they are being domesticated by being feed during the daylight hours.

We are calling trappers to trap as many as we can, but they keep coming. With 200+ acres of vacant shoreline property next door, there is no telling how many are out there. These trappers are not free, we have to pay them.

This is not fair to the residents of the community and it's not fair to the raccoons.

You can call Indian River County Animal Control at 772-226-4799 if you ever see any animal that is incapacitated.

The Annual Inspection task lists have been mailed. Please contact the office within 30 days of receiving your notice stating your plans for completion. The work does not need to be completed within 30 days; it is just to acknowledge that you intend to do so.

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

Some snowbirds return to Garden Grove before hurricane season is over in November. So, we have scheduled our annual hurricane briefing for Monday April 14th at 1:30 PM to enable snowbirds to attend, as well as new residents, and anyone who would like an update.

The briefing gives a comprehensive overview of hurricanes and the risks in Garden Grove as well as how to plan ahead. It includes a show-and-tell of some useful tools and devices. We will also show a couple of pertinent videos.

What does our Hurricane Preparedness Group do and how can you help them? They don't make plans for you and they don't make decisions for you but their role is important. We could use a few more volunteers. Contact Gordon at 724 695 7892 to find out more.

CERT (Community Emergency Response Team)

After a disaster, there will be some people that venture out with concern for your neighbors, pets, etc. It was found that many of these well-meaning people become casualties themselves because they were unaware of the many dangers involved. So, a national organization indorsed by FEMA was formed to provide training to volunteers. Indian River County has a robust CERT organization, rejuvenated after Covid, and a few people with Garden Grove have been trained.

For safety reasons, Professional Responders do not go out on calls during a major disaster. After the disaster has passed and after obstacles and dangers are cleared these Professional Responders are prioritizing their next steps. So, in reality, your first responders could actually be your neighbors, some of them CERT certified.














**Just a head's up our May Social Club meeting will be May 20 instead of May 13, as I will be away on the 13th.


--PARTIES & EVENTS:
