The Safety Committee tries to keep us safe, led by Gordon Kemp. Denise Crapo pushed for the AEDs and training in the clubhouse. It has been roundly supported by the community and you could save the life of your loved one or neighbor. It is NOT HARD to do but it does take caring. Tripping hazards on the perimeter sidewalks have been addressed. The dangerously sloping sidewalks in front of the clubhouse are folded into Rita Billheimer's ongoing efforts for the Past & Present Memory Walkway, giving members the opportunity to support the walkway by making your own mark, or by memorialize those who have enjoyed or contributed so much to this unique community. Speeding is an ongoing issue and the Board has just voted to improve the signage as recommended by the Safety Committee. 
