

2023 ANNUAL MEETING

The Annual Meeting of the membership is scheduled for Wednesday, December 6, at 7:00 PM. Your voting package will be distributed in mid-November and will include two (2) proposed amendments to the Garden Grove Covenants, Conditions & Restrictions, as well as your ballot for the board member election.

The two (2) proposed amendments are:

- 1. To allow the installation of screen enclosures at backyard patios.
- To increase the Capital Contribution collected on resales.

This information, stating the exact wording, was mailed to all owners of record for your review.

DECORATIONS

REMINDERS:

- Fall & Halloween decorations need to come down by Nov 5th.
- Christmas decorations can go up 2 weeks prior to the holiday -or- anytime after the clubhouse is decorated.
- Your mailbox electrical outlet only works when the mailbox light is on, they are wired to a light sensor. The mailbox outlet is for decorating of the mailbox only.

RESERVE BUDGET

From time to time, the Board is asked questions as to what is included in a Reserve Budget & how it is to be used. Our Governing Documents require that funds be accumulated for major replacements and repairs. These funds are placed in a separate account and calculated differently than the operating account. When preparing the reserve categories, we will take into consideration the estimated useful life of an asset, the amount of money that will be required, with cost increases, to make the repair or replacement so that the funds are available when actually needed.

As an example: We project replacing the clubhouse air conditioners every 10 years and budget an amount each year until we reach the total amount needed in the tenth year. So then when a replacement is necessary, the funds are available.

The reserve categories are designed to ensure that funds will be available when repairs or replacements are needed without the necessity of a special assessment or a large increase in the annual budget. This is referred to as "fully funded". Garden Grove has a 37-line-item reserve schedule, which has been well developed for many years and reevaluated each and every year, by the Board, Management and the Finance Committee.
