SPEED LIMIT IN GARDEN GROVE

 - Coil and secure your hoses
 - Bring inside all exterior furniture if possible (if unable to do so, at least tie all items together securely)
 - Remove hanging signs, decorations, small potted plants and all hanging plants in pots
 - Bring in your trash & recycle containers or secure them outside.
 - Realty signs
 - Loose gutters and downspouts
 - Secure storm doors

INDIAN RIVER LAND TRUST

As you are aware, IR Land Trust owns the 200+ acres of conservation primitive land north of Garden Grove, which they have named The Coastal Oaks Preserve. This land also includes more than a mile of undeveloped shoreline. The only part of this acreage ever occupied was a 30-acre portion that fronts US1 and was at one time an orange grove.

We will be inviting Land Trust to Garden Grove to give a presentation to the residents and share their upcoming plans. To follow is some information from our recent communication with the Indian River Land Trust, Director of Land Stewardship:

"At long last, the Indian River Land Trust has permits in hand and is on the cusp of beginning construction of the "living classroom" facilities to enable education and research activities at its Coastal Oaks Preserve. Contractors have been selected and we expect work to begin along US1 within a couple of weeks to change the current U-turn lane to a left turn lane into a new entrance, but this should have limited impact on traffic. The work along US1 should be complete before the start of "the season."

The new entrance will be north of the FDOT stormwater pond. The gathering pavilion with restrooms will be positioned near the forest edge about ¼ mile from US1 so you will be able to spot it but it will not be obvious, particularly after the associated landscaping matures.

Please note that while construction is ongoing, the site is not open to the public. Following construction, which will likely take the better part of a year, the Land Trust intends to invite Garden Grove residents to visit and explore. Due to Land Trust staffing limitations, the Preserve will only be open by appointment to our education and research partners, but we do intend to have some "open house" days for our neighbors."

Garden Grove is certainly lucky to have Indian River Land Trust as their neighbor.

POWER OUTAGES

As you know, Florida is notorious for power outages. If you are a snow-bird, world traveler, or evacuated due to a hurricane, here is a tip that will let you know instantly if there has been a power outage while you were away, as well as the duration of the outage.

Get a coffee mug, fill it with water & put it in the freezer. Freeze it solid. Once it is frozen solid, then place a quarter on top and leave it in your freezer. That way, when you return, you can tell if your food went completely bad and just refroze or it stayed frozen while you were gone.

If the quarter has fallen to the bottom of the cup, that means your food defrosted and should be disposed of. But if the quarter is still on top or in the middle of the cup your food may still be ok.


