The Garden Grove Club Board of Directors would like to wish all of our owners, residents & their families a very Merry Christmas and holiday season.

Treasurer's Report APPROVED BUDGET - 2026

At the Board of Directors monthly meeting held on November 14, 2025, the Board of Directors approved the Operating and Reserve Budget for the fiscal year 2026. The Finance Committee held several meetings to review and discuss all projects, reserves and intended expenses for the 2026 year. At the conclusion of the sessions, they recommended a budget to the Board of Directors for their consideration.

The Finance Committee is comprised of: Rose Truglio – Chairman. Members: Marvin Bilheimer, Gordon Kemp, Jean Dillon, Mary Lou Rush and Amy Cavasinni.

The Board of Directors adopted the budget at their November 14th meeting and thanks to the good budgeting practices of our Board of Directors, Finance Committee and Management we were able to keep your increase to a reasonable level. Due to increases in contract services and insurance premiums, it is necessary to increase the monthly fees by \$8.00 for the 2026 budget year. This \$8.00 represents a 2.6% increase.

The 2026 Operating Budget will be \$825,340.00 and the Reserve Funding will be \$92,417.00 for a total of \$917,757.00 -- bringing the monthly homeowner's contribution for 2026 to \$320.00 per home, per month.

With the Special Assessment funding of \$1,500.00 per household, we were able to accomplish many of the projects that are necessary for maintaining an aging community. It takes everyone's support to keep Garden Grove healthy & flourishing.

ENTRY SYSTEM

We are noticing that many of the vendors are still having difficulty entering when instructed to use a code number. Please instruct your vendors to select the option "using an entry code". Most likely they are selecting "calling a resident" which will not gain them access.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

The ongoing plan with Waste Management, through Indian River County, is to return all of the old carts and contact them directly if you would like to swap one of your new carts for a smaller size.

The alternative cart sizes are: 35 gal - 65 gal - 95 gal

If you have any of the old carts waiting for removal pickup, please lay it on its side for easy identification.
