2016 Report

People Helping People assists people in this area with the basic necessities of living

CLOTHING SHOES & SMALL HOUSEHOLD ITEMS 14,532 Each individual may select free clothes and shoes (1 bag per person) & one carry out item (such as a lamp or coat) once each month

Persons must come in to select these items.

All members of a family must be present the first time.

We do not turn anyone away and we serve all counties of SE TN and some neighboring states.

In 2016, we served a total of 14,532 people.

225 were new people who had never been helped by us before.

COMMUNITY KITCHEN 6,383 meals

We assist those who cannot afford to eat well. Anyone can eat a delicious, cooked, hot meal 4 days per week for a small donation. The kitchen is state inspected and must pay annual license fees.

In 2016, we served 6,383 plates of food.

FOOD DISTRIBUTION Non-Perishable 848 bags

Our monthly Food Distribution gives a free bag of non-perishable food to anyone. Distributions are held on 1st Monday & 3rd Thursday of each month and is need based instead of income based.

In 2016 we gave 848 bags of food to 330 households, helping to feed 864 people

ages 0-18 ages 19-34 ages 35-64 ages 65 and over **288 162 334 80**

EXTRA FOOD Vegetables, Fruit, Water 3,443 bags

Food partners such as the Mennonite community in Englewood, the Old Sawmill Market in Ocoee, Crystal Geyser Water Co in Benton and others regularly donate vegetables, fruit, water and more. These free items are given out as they are available In **2016**, we gave **3.443** bags of food or water

SUMMER FEEDING PROGRAM 15,000 meals Through a state sponsored program, we provided meals to area children in an 8 week summer period. These meals help ensure that children do not go hungry during the summer when school meals are not available and were distributed at 13 partner sites across the county. These sites included public schools, summer camps and special training, 4-H camp, churches VBS, Boys & Girls Club.

In 2016, we provided 15,000 meals

MILITARY & VETERANS 1,902 vets

PHP assists military and veterans families with clothing, food, household items. In **2016**, we assisted **1,902** active military, veterans or their families.

THE LEARNING CENTER

Our affordable, low cost Learning Center teaches children ages infant to school age. Children are separated into 2 age appropriate classrooms with learning based curriculum that provides an atmosphere dedicated to learning and prepares the child for his/her emergence into the school system.

TLC incorporates early intervention, learning field trips, Pre-K and Kindergarten readiness and relationship building. We have creative field trips within the area that provide a stimulating environment for children to grow and learn. We also provide periodic community service opportunities, because the best way for a child to learn is through hands on experience.

While at TLC, the children receive nutritious breakfast, lunch and snacks.

The Learning Center is open 5 days per week from 6:30am – 5:30pm.

CRISIS CARE & SPECIAL ASSISTANCE 112 people

CRISIS CARE gives free necessary items such as new hygiene & cleaning supplies, clothes, shoes, furniture & household items, etc. to persons who have suffered from a major event such as: natural disaster (tornado, flood, etc), fire, domestic violence, and loss of job or incarceration.

This assistance is coordinated in partnership with the American Red Cross and West Polk Fire and Rescue .During the late November tornado crisis, we assisted 68 people (35 families) and the aid is still ongoing. A special thank you to those who donated SPECIAL ASSISTANCE may provide help with rent, utilities or other special needs. This assistance requires a completed application, is need based and as funds are available.

In 2016 we helped 112 people

MEDICAL EQUIPMENT & SUPPLIES 239 people LARGE ITEMS

178 families

We assist those in need of free medical equipment or supplies such as walkers, crutches, canes, shower chairs, etc.

We also provided free adult diapers and other medical supplies, as available.

This assistance is all free of charge and in **2016** we helped **239 people**.

We also assist with free furniture, appliances bedding, etc. These are allowed monthly – one per household as available.

In 2016 we helped 178 families.

VOLUNTEERS 330 volunteers 7,376 hours

People Helping People relies heavily on volunteers to perform a variety of tasks necessary to operate a non-profit assistance organization.
