#### Historical Society Museum Saturday Open Houses Resuming April 7 10:00 AM - 1:00 PM

When our Historical Society Museum opens its doors for the 2018 season on Saturday April 7 at 10 AM, visitors will be greeted by a new Wheelchair Lift.

The lift will allow handicap access to our Museum's main level. It can be accessed via a ramp from the Lockville Road sidewalk to the rear of the Museum. On-street parking is available on Columbus Street along with

Saturday and evening public parking at 51 E. Columbus (Pickerington's Building Department lot located across from the Olde Village Diner).

The lift was purchased through grants the Historical Society received from PNC Bank and the Fairfield County Foundation. Our thanks to the City of Pickerington and Violet Township for helping fund and coordinate this project with contractors and the lift supplier.

Agnes Meyer Driscoll (1889-1971), known as "the first lady of naval cryptology," came to Westerville with her family when she was six. She studied math, physics, music, and languages at Otterbein and OSU. Driscoll joined the Navy and became one of its top WWI cryptographers. Her principal achievement was decrypting secret codes used by the Japanese military and diplomats before and during WWII. Hear Travis Risner of Westerville as he provides a glimpse into the life of this extraordinary woman. This program and refreshments are free and open to the public.

The Violet Township Fire Department was created in 1955 and staffed by volunteers until 1985 when a full-time fire chief and four firefighters were hired. This fire station was razed in 2017 to make way for the new Fire Station #591 shown at right.

## Special April-June Exhibit: The Hanna Family

Take a nostalgic tour through mid-1900's downtown Pickerington via artifacts donated by the family of Sylvia and Harry Hanna. The couple were known for their "Hanna House" hospitality at their home purchased for \$1400 in 1922 at 36 W. Columbus St. Their Chrysler-Plymouth dealership/garage was built next door at 30 W. Columbus St.

This exhibit will be featured at our Historical Museum April thru June. It includes dresses, hats, and other accessories worn by Sylvia Hanna (1891-1951) along with photos and memories of Harry H. Hanna's (1894-1974) auto dealership/garage and surrounding downtown Pickerington businesses.

Historical Society Lifetime Member, Betty Hanna, was married to Sylvia and Harry Hanna's son, Bill Hanna (1921-1986). Betty passed away December 12, 2017 at the age of 95. Betty and Bill were married in 1942 and lived in three different downtown Pickerington homes, including the "Hanna House".

In a 1997 recording for our Historical Society, Betty talked about downtown residents and businesses, including her father-in-law's car dealership and garage:

"Someone from Columbus came in, bought a new car and paid for it with a can of silver dollars.

"The garage contained a coal stove surrounded by a bunch of seats. Guys would sit down and talk for hours. Lonn Moore (for a long time I thought his name was 'lawnmower') would tell stories about his pitching days with the Cleveland baseball team. There were two gas pumps out front. People would stop and ask for gas in the middle of the night. One night Harry heard a noise, went for his gun, and headed outdoors. Sylvia ran after him shouting, 'Harry, Harry, here's the bullets!"
