LOCAL HISTORY

Pickerington-Violet Township Historical Society Museum: How it came to be ...











← May 18, 1987: Pickerington-Violet Township Historical Society was organized and Gary Weaver selected as the group's first president. The Mason-Richter building at 21 W. Columbus Street served as the Historical Society's first headquarters.

← Sept. 1, 1990: Shown at left are two postcards celebrating Pickerington's 175th birthday. The drawings depict the Mason-Richter Building (the Historical Society's first home), and their soon-to-be new home in the Carnegie Library.

← June 3, 1993: Historical Society members met at the Carnegie Library to begin moving items from the Richter building into the Carnegie building. The City of Pickerington leased the Carnegie Library to the Pickerington-Violet Twp Historical Society for 99 years. Society membership at this time numbered 132.

← June 6, 1993: A dedication ceremony was held for the newly constructed Pickerington Public Library on Opportunity Way. A \$3.1 million bond issue approved by voters enabled construction. The new facility replaced the Pickerington Public Library residing in the Carnegie Library building in Olde Pickerington Village since 1916.

← September 2, 1993: The Carnegie Library was entered into the National Register of Historic Places by the National Park Service. Memorabilia and furniture from the Richter Building had been transferred to its new home; and meetings and events were held at this new location. The Historical Society Board of Trustees decided to hold a grand opening of the new Museum during the Fall of 1994 as seen in this 1994 photo.
