Review/choose an available time, then click on the button to sign up.


We'll email you an invoice to pay by credit card.

# Pickerington's Downtown: Then & Now



← 1958: Williamson's Sunoco.

During the Summer of 2025, this former Hill Road Service Station is being transformed to serve residents with a two-story Johnson's Ice Cream Parlor! →





← 1950: Moore's Pool Hall. Butch & Wilma Moore operated this 14 E. Columbus St. restaurant until they sold it in 1957 to open Moore's Pool Room at 18 E. Columbus St. This building now houses Solomon's Carpet . →





← Late 1800's Valley House: This hotel was located at the NW corner of what is now Columbus/Center Streets. The building was consumed by a historic fire in 1927. Gazebo Park and a 1929 historic building, currently for sale, now occupy the property. →





← 1973 Village Food Center (aka Kelley's Food Market) located at 30 W. Columbus St. Originally, this building was the home of Hanna's Garage. Since 1993 its been home to Resale Furniture and Antiques. →





← 1880: Jacob Pickering was the first owner of this 115 N Center St. property, followed by violinist John Hisey, then school superintendent W.H.C. Akers. The building now houses a group of Pickerington Attorneys. →





←Circa 1910: Pickerington's Train Depot/Flour Mill are seen here on what is now North Center Street. The Flour Mill was dismantled in the mid-1970s, but the Depot still stands . →
