2023-24 Window Repair Project Update: A year ago, Window Gurus (from Plain City) evaluated our Museum windows which have been in a state of disrepair. They recommended rebuilding the sash of four Museum upper level north-facing windows at a cost of \$2,215. In addition, Window Gurus recommended (1) that the windows be painted and reglazed; (2) yearly window maintenance be performed including cleaning sills, checking window bottoms for softness/paint/stain touch up, and spraying silicone lubricant on the side zinc tracks. A cost estimate for these additional window repair/maintenance projects still

needs to be obtained from vendors. We are hoping to acquire all of the necessary cost estimates and begin the window project in 2024.

Air Conditioners: The City of Pickerington's Brett Thompson and his crew (seen at right) came to our Historical Museum's rescue by installing two new air conditioners to replace two that died during September. We purchased them on Amazon for \$1138. Our building has a total of four air conditioners, two on each level.

SimpliSafe: During the summer, we equipped our Historical Museum with SimpliSafe, a self-installed security monitoring system. This new protection for our Museum is working well without any problems.

Check Out Recent Donations to our Museum!

"A few years before Prohibition, in 1912, there was a referendum in Pickerington with the Village being voted DRY. Previously, there had always been one or more saloons.

It was said that a local doctor would sign an entire book of prescriptions — each for 8 ounces of whiskey — and leave it at the local pharmacy. The druggist would merely fill in the purchaser's name. The bottles were filled with Clover Leaf Whiskey.

Not long afterwards, the druggist bought a farm on Stemen Road. The natives immediately called it "Clover Leaf Farm". I knew both men.

This bottle of Clover Leaf Whiskey was found in the trash at Pickerington's Railroad Station when John Grunewald refurbished the Depot during the 1970s."

The podium and gavels seen in this photo were used in Violet Grange Hall \rightarrow for many years. These artifacts recently were donated to our Historical Society Museum by Violet Township resident, Denise Kehl Barte.

Violet Grange was organized in 1914 by 35 area farm families. Membership during the 1940s and 50s peaked with 250 members. On February 22, 1954 members held their first meeting in a new hall they constructed at 36 Lockville Road. The group continued to organize many dinners, events, and charitable projects over the years. Farm membership eventually declined, and in 2008 the group's remaining 28 members sold their property to Violet Township. The Grange Hall was razed in 2015 to make way for a parking lot for an expanded Violet Township Fire Station constructed across the street.
