Because of dwindling attendance at the Pickerington High School Alumni Banquets for quite a few years and other concerns, the Alumni Association Committee determined this year's June 5th Banquet will be the group's last.

The Committee consists of Keith and Dorothy Ebright, Gary Taylor, Rick Ricketts, Kristi Dunlap Huskey, Dan Whims, and Dixie McManus.

Alumni of the Pickerington High Schools have gathered for banquets since the school's first graduation in 1909. However, the earliest Alumni Banquet program we could find in records at the Pickerington-Violet Township Historical Society Museum dates back to 1937.

During this year's Alumni Banquet, the following classes will be honored: 1945, 1946, 1970, 1971. The 1946 graduates can be seen in the photo above. Oscar McVeigh was the 1946 class president.

The original framed composite photos of graduates from Violet Township/Pickerington High School classes — 1909 through 1981 — are on display in the Pickerington-Violet Township Historical Society Museum.

In order to preserve this one-of-a-kind collection, the Historical Society Board of Trustees has been working on a project to digitize all of the class photos and place the copied unframed photos in a display rack(s).

Donations are being solicited to help with the cost of display racks, estimated to be approximately \$2,000 for one rack.

Additional funds will be needed to repair and preserve damaged photos, digitize them, and purchase archival-quality storage boxes for the original photos. Anticipated total cost of this project is \$5,000.
