


Don't Miss These Fall/Holiday Museum Events


Pickerington's downtown!



Early Pickerington History

The early 1900's booklets shown at left were complimentary for customers at James Schirm's Drug Store located at 19 W. Columbus Street in Pickerington. The Drug Store occupied the downstairs while Mr. & Mrs. Schirm lived upstairs. These types of booklets held information about weather forecasts along with medical advice for people and farm animals. The booklets can be seen in our Museum on Sunday, Oct. 6, from

2-4pm when Toby Scofield and Jack Whitaker present "Elixirs, Poisons & Cures." Admission to this Historical Museum event is free!

Keeping Track of Pickerington-Violet Township Artifacts

Most days our Historical Museum's new Curator (Peggy Winter) and new Librarian (Terry Guay), can be seen surrounded by books containing donation information, a laptop, and file cabinets/glass cases filled with artifacts of many shapes and sizes.

Earlier this year, they started their journey of tracking our local antiquities with training and assistance from the Ohio History Connection. The duo's work really began when they tackled matching donation accession numbers to the artifacts housed in cabinets and hanging on the walls in our Museum's lower level. Currently, they are working on tracking items on the mezzanine level, and hope to finish the Museum's main level collections before the end of 2024.

Their plan is to computerize information (artifact, donor, location, and accession number) so that the

thousands of artifacts housed in our Museum can easily be tracked and found when visitors are looking for a particular item.

Peggy and Terry already have updated our "Artifact Information Sheet" that new donors are now completing.

Be sure to stop by the Pickerington-Violet Township Historical Society Museum during one of our Sunday Afternoon Open Houses to meet Peggy and Terry and see what they've been doing to help make our Museum and its artifacts easier to find.




Help welcome our new Pickerington-Violet Township Historical Society Members
