
"History of Pickerington Schools" & Student Art Show!

Dinner is free for members. If you would like to bring a guest, the cost will be \$20 per person and your guest will receive a free 2026 membership to our Society.



LOCAL HISTORY

Pickerington's Old Graveyard

Pickerington's first graveyard, Dovel Memorial Cemetery, lies behind and adjacent to the former Dovel Memorial U. B. Church at 170 E. Columbus Street. Both were named after Jacob Dovel when he acquired 320 acres upon his arrival in Pickerington during the 1820s.

Both Jacob Dovel and wife Elizabeth are buried in Dovel Cemetery, along with Pickerington founder Abraham Pickering, dozens of Pickering relatives, and many other early Pickerington settlers.
