When George Floyd cried, calling out to his mother while being murdered by a police officer, his cry disturbed the earth. He spoke to each and every one of us in his death. His cry was thunder in the desert that awakened nations everywhere. Diverse cultures came together from all walks of life. We stood strong!

As we find the grace to move forward and get out and vote on election day, I extend soft Kleenex to wipe your teardrops. There is a season, a time appointed, for everything. This season and every season thereafter is here for us to be silent no more. Silence does nothing. Strength does everything.

I do not have all the answers, but I will continue to work with officials, mentors, and experts to seek answers and educate our community. It is important for us to stay involved, to find solutions to the difficult problems America is facing.

Being part of the NAACP opens up many doors. The NAACP brings awareness to our communities, supports small businesses, and promotes volunteering. On June 3, 2020, I was invited to the NAACP emergency tele-town hall call with US Representative Val Demmings, NAACP President and CEO Derrick Johnson, CNN Political Commentator Keith Boykin, US Senator Cory Booker, and retired Public Safety Director of Dekalb County, Georgia, Dr. Cedric Alexander. We addressed the recent acts of police brutality. Heartless acts did not start today, though. They started four hundred years ago. With your help we can demand change. The

suffering we all have faced during this pandemic has built character in us. We have grown ever stronger.

William Shakespeare reminds us, "To thine own self be true." Do not lose hope. Hope does not disappoint. I hope this statement gives you clear direction, new meaning, as we use the principle of self-examination.
