Understanding Membership Rights, Responsibilities, and Participation

Why This Matters

Owning property in a Property Owners Association automatically makes you a member of the Association. Membership brings both opportunities and responsibilities.

Understanding your role as a member helps you participate more effectively, stay informed, and contribute to the success of your community.

A healthy Association depends not only on good leadership, but also on informed and engaged members.

What Does It Mean to Be a Member?

Membership means you are part of the Association that serves your community.

While the Board of Directors manages the day-to-day affairs of the Association, members remain an essential part of its governance.

Members elect directors, vote on matters reserved to the membership, provide ideas and feedback, volunteer their time, and help shape the future of the community.

Every property owner has a role to play.

Membership Includes Both Rights and Responsibilities

Membership is a balance.

Just as members enjoy certain rights within the Association, they also share responsibilities that help the community function effectively.

Both are important.

Member Rights

While the specific rights of members are established by the Association's governing documents, members commonly have opportunities to:

- Vote in elections and on matters reserved to the membership.
- Attend Annual Members Meetings.
- Attend open Board meetings.
- Observe how Association business is conducted.
- Receive required notices and information.
- Review Association records in accordance with established procedures.
- Serve on committees or volunteer for Association projects.
- Seek election to the Board of Directors if qualified.

These rights help ensure that members remain informed and have opportunities to participate in the governance of their Association.

Member Responsibilities

Membership also includes responsibilities that contribute to a successful community.

Examples include:

- Paying assessments and other authorized charges when due.
- Following the Association's governing documents.
- Maintaining property as required by the governing documents.
- Respecting established meeting procedures.
- Staying informed about Association business.
- Participating in elections and Annual Members Meetings whenever possible.
- Treating neighbors, volunteers, committee members, and directors with courtesy and respect.

Strong communities are built when members not only understand their rights, but also embrace their responsibilities.

Participation Matters

Every member has a voice.

Some members choose to serve on the Board.

Others volunteer on committees, assist with community projects, or share ideas during Member Comment periods.

Some simply stay informed and vote in elections.

There is no single way to contribute.

The important thing is that members remain informed and participate in ways that help strengthen the Association.

Respectful Participation Benefits Everyone

Property owners will not always agree on every issue.

Different opinions are a natural part of any community.

Healthy Associations encourage respectful discussion, thoughtful consideration of different viewpoints, and constructive participation through the processes established by the Association.

When members share ideas respectfully and remain informed about how the Association operates, they help create a stronger and more effective community.

Working Together

The Association works best when everyone understands their role.

Members elect the Board.

The Board manages the affairs of the Association.

Committees and volunteers provide valuable support.

Together, these groups help preserve the community, protect property values, and serve the interests of all property owners.

Good governance is a partnership.
