Gamma XI Boulé Foundation Awards Scholarships

The Gamma Xi Boulé Foundation awarded scholarships to three outstanding local area high school graduates at its annual scholarship ceremony on May 25, 2019. This year's ceremony marks the first awards from scholarships funded by Gamma Xi Boulé member Donald R. Reaves and his wife Deborah R. Reaves and Gamma Xi Boulé member Robert L. Wood and his wife Angelia D. Wood. Zhameera Fuller, will receive \$ 4,000 per year for the next four years from the Donald J. and Deborah J. Reaves Scholarship. Ms. Fuller, a 2019 Booker High School Graduate, plans to study child psychology when she enrolls at the University of North Florida in the fall. Marc Brunot, is a 2017 graduate of Bayshore High School. He earned a \$ 4,000 annual Matthew Carter Scholarship in 2017.

The Gamma Xi Boulé Foundation created the Matthew Carter Scholarship to honor Matthew Carter, who was a charter member of Gamma Xi Boulé. Mr. Brunot will begin his junior year as a business major at Florida Gulf Coast University in the fall. Maicy Powell, will receive \$ 4,000 per year for the next four years from the Robert L. and Angelia D. Wood Scholarship. Ms. Powell graduated from Booker High School in May and she will matriculate in the fall at Howard University as a business administration major.

The Gamma Xi Boulé Foundation has awarded approximately \$ 65,000 in scholarships to outstanding high school graduates since 2001.





Meet Our Newest Interns

Gamma Xi Boulé partners with Booker HS in Sarasota county and Southeast HS in Manatee county to provide paid internships for high school students with local employers in professional settings.

The students are paid \$10 per hour and the Gamma Xi Foundation pays 50% of the student's costs. The students work up to 10 hours per week during the fall and spring semesters.

Prior to beginning the internships, students are required to attend a 'business etiquette workshop' conducted by members of the Boulé. The workshop teaches students how to write resumes, interview skills, office decorum and how to dress for success.

Some of our internship partners include The Sarasota Police Dept., WBTT, Herald-Tribune, Sarasota Collection Home Design Store, Mullet Aluminum, Sarasota Memorial Hospital and University of South Florida. Since the internship program began in 2016, Gamma Xi has sponsored 14 student interns.
