### **Our Aim**

DIYDG aim to provide a transition to education support service for young people disengaged, or at risk of disengaging from education, training and employment. DIYDG hopes to connect young people with positive role models, develop a sense of identity, build resilience and develop their emotional intelligence.





# **DIYDG Way of Learning**

Dr Yunkaporta's 8 ways is expressed as eight interconnected pedagogies that encompass Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander ways of learning. DIYDG have created activities which draw on each of the learning styles to provide young people greater opportunity to view education and employment in a framework they will understand.



DIYDG empower the Kunjur First Nations Mens Collective who support young men and adults to reconnect to country and kin, to ground their emotions and build resilience. Level UP will partner with Kunjur to engage young people in on-country learning each week and empower role model positive behaviour.



Internationally renowned singer song writer Naomi Wenitong, has developed a music program called Naytive Mentorship. Young people have the opportunity to write their own lyrics, record their songs and produce their own videos. Each session has been curriculum aligned to support young people with their transition back into mainstream education.
