N1 Basketball Program Obligation

Commitment: An AAU season can run from 2-3 months (Spring or Fall). Player commitment is imperative to the program. This means all practices and games. Any lack of participation can impact a team's cohesiveness and player's personal development. We want our athletes to learn to plan and budget their time effectively. Outside of school, illness or religious obligation, players/parents must communicate to their head coach.

Team Practice: Attendance at team practices and workouts are required. Lack of participation, or excessive absences will impact participation and potentially lead to dismissal of the team. We understand there are other commitments (sports) that can impact a player's participation. Coaches must be made aware early in the selection process of any potential conflicts. N1 coaches do their best as it pertains to the overall team objective and plan practices based upon everyone's attendance. However, when new formations, plays and defensive schemes are introduced, players who miss practices suffer the most as this will not only impact their understanding but playing time as well.

Playing Time: Coaches will provide opportunity and every player must earn his/her playing time through hard work, dedication, and willingness to improve. It is NOT guaranteed. However, everyone will get an opportunity to play on the court, but time may not be equal. We understand this can be difficult and parents can sometimes see the game through their players' eyes. We ask that you help encourage them to do their best and work with the coach on ways to improve. This is how player development and perseverance are accomplished.

Travel: League games and tournaments may require long-distance travel. N1 staff members work to provide location information through our app. We ask that you allow plenty of time and as a rule of thumb, try and arrive 30 min prior to game time. This is to avoid traffic concerns, games starting early, or issues with the venue such as parking. N1 participates in local, state, and regional tournaments which are held on the weekends. Tournament placements are dependent on coaches' assessment of his/her team. However preliminary schedules are announced during tryouts.

Coaching: N1 Coaches take pride in providing quality coaching. Each coach is committed to providing foundational training and skill development for the next level of play. We take coaching very seriously and ask that parents allow the coaches to coach the team during game play. Parents/spectators must refrain from yelling out instructions as it could be counterproductive to instructions being given by the coach. Please stay positive and give coaches the opportunity to provide a safe, fun environment to help foster player development.

Cancellation/Refund Policy: Refunds are very rarely given, so please read all text below.

The uniform fee of \$125 immediately after accepting is nonrefundable under any circumstances. The remaining registration fee may be refunded under very limited circumstances (please see next paragraph). Please note that absolutely no refunds will be issued after the start of the first practice.

N1 Basketball will provide a refund if (1) a request is made more than 10 days prior to the start-date of the program — the first practice and (2) the basis for the request is either an injury or illness the onset of which occurs prior to the start-date of the program and is verified by a physician's note. N1 Basketball will not provide a refund because of an injury or illness that occurs after the start-date of the program. In its sole discretion, N1 Basketball may consider a pro rata credit that may be used against future registration fee if a player is injured after the start-date of the program.

Except as expressly provided above N1 will NOT provide a refund or consider a pro rata credit. To be clear, N1 Basketball will not provide a refund for any of the following reasons:

- (a) Schedule conflicts
- (b) Family Emergency
- (c) Parent/Participant changes his/her mind
- (d) Dissatisfied with the coach/program
- (e) Dissatisfied with the team assignment
- (f) Program is too challenging
