AMY PRICE AZANO

Director, Virginia Tech Center for Rural Education, and faculty member in the School of Education.

A first-generation college student, Dr. Azano grew up in a small rural town in Virginia's Shenandoah Valley and taught high school English before earning her Ph.D. in Education at the University of Virginia in 2009. At Virginia Tech, she directs the Summer Enrichment Experience (SEE VT) and the Supporting Autism Friendly Environments (SAFE) Program. She is also the Principal Investigator for the Appalachian Rural Talent Initiative, Chair of the Rural Education Special Interest Group of the American Educational Research Association, and co-editor of The Rural Educator. Dr. Azano's scholarship focuses on equity issues in rural schooling, with a focus on special populations and talent development. She co-authored the first text dedicated to rural preservice education, Teaching in Rural Places: Thriving in Classrooms, Schools, and Communities; co-edited The Bloomsbury Handbook of Rural Education in the United States; and has authored or co-authored more than 50 peer-reviewed journal articles and book chapters.

BENJAMIN CHAPMAN

Department Head of Agricultural and Human Sciences; Professor and Director of the Safe Plates Food Safety Extension and Research Program, North Carolina State University

As a teenager a Saturday afternoon viewing of the classic cable movie, Outbreak, sparked his interest in pathogens and public health. With the goal of reducing foodborne illness, his group researches food handling and food safety systems; designs and implements food safety strategies; and evaluates messages and media from farm-to-fork. Through reality-based research, the Safe Plates program investigates behaviors and creates interventions aimed at amateur and professional food handlers, managers, and organizational decision makers: the gatekeepers of safe food. Ben also provides leadership to the food sector, serving as Project Director for FoodCoVNET, a collective of food safety professionals conducting research and outreach around COVID-19 concerns in the food supply chain. Ben is the Co-Chair of STOP Foodborne Illness board of directors, an advocacy group for individuals affected by foodborne pathogens. Ben also co-hosts two podcasts, Food Safety Talk and Risky or Not as well as participates in social media. Find him at @benjaminchapman on Twitter.

RAY STARLING

General Counsel, North Carolina Chamber of Commerce; President of the North Carolina Chamber Legal I in the School of Education.

Ray obtained a B.S. in Agricultural Education from NC State University and his J.D., with honors, from the University of North Carolina School of Law. After law school, Ray clerked for a State Supreme Court Justice, practiced law at an international law firm, and became the General Counsel to the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, and later served as the General Counsel and agriculture policy adviser to the NC Speaker of the House. In 2015, Ray served as the Chief Counsel and agricultural policy adviser to US Senator Thom Tillis and eventually became the Senator's Chief of Staff. In 2017, Ray was tapped to staff the National Economic Council at the White House as the Special Assistant to the President for agricultural policy. He later served as Chief of Staff to United States Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue. Currently, as General Counsel to the North Carolina Chamber of Commerce and as President of the NC Chamber Legal Institute, he also serves as an Executive Advisor to Aimpoint Research, a leading agriculture and food sector firm that relies on military intelligence techniques to predict and prepare for trends impacting the industry.

ANDY CURLISS

National Director of Strategic Initiatives, SAS Institute

SAS is the global leader in analytics and artificial intelligence. In his role, Andy crafts and executes strategy with solutions in support of SAS customers across the U.S. in both the government and commercial sectors while also serving as a strategic adviser to company leadership. Prior to joining SAS, Andy was a leader in the pork industry, serving as global director of external affairs at Smithfield Foods and, before that, as CEO of the North Carolina Pork Council. In both roles, he guided strategy and tactics at the intersection of business planning, public policy, strategic communications, and stakeholder management. He has been recognized with numerous state and national awards. He has held multiple fellowships and external appointments, allowing him the opportunity to study food systems in Asia, Europe, and South America. He has volunteered in a variety of board positions and roles at NC State University, NC A&T State University, the NC Biotechnology Center, and with several nonprofit foundations in support of agriculture.

COURTNEY MEYERS

Professor, Department of Agricultural Education and Communications, Texas Tech University

Courtney has developed an international reputation as a scholar in agricultural communications. Dr. Meyers is a member of Texas Tech's Teaching Academy and has received teaching awards at the college, university, and national levels. The U.S. Fulbright Scholar Program supports university students, faculty, administrators, and researchers to complete international experiences to encourage cultural exchange that leads to mutual understanding. Dr. Courtney Meyers, Texas Tech University, will share her experience of completing a 5-month Fulbright Scholar program in Wagga Wagga, NSW, Australia. She'll provide advice for the application process, moving to another country, and how to make the most of your time. She'll also share ideas for additional research topics in Australia related to agricultural communications, agricultural education, agricultural leadership, and agricultural extension.
