An Americanism dating from 1910-1915, a doohickey is a gadget; a dingus; a thingumabob; a nifty quilting tool that a quilter may want, has never heard of, or is too expensive to purchase.

Each month a new Doohickey is offered to our membership. It may be a new "cool" tool or it may be something tried and true; expensive or not so much. Tickets are \$1.00 and monthly prizes are determined by the number of tickets sold the previous month. The winning ticket will be drawn at the end of the evening meeting.



The January/February Doohickey consists of a Quilty Box valued at \$48 (received as a gift from Quilty Box) and a Lyfstyle cutting mat. Cost \$25—Value priceless! This mat is a new product that is currently discounted by 45% to encourage beta testers. This tester (who purchased one for herself as well as for the Doohickey) highly recommends this mat. Easy to turn and the bottom section stays put. Makes cutting those little pieces sew much easier!!

Well happy new year, we have tried to hit the ground running and January's weather slowed that down. So we will meet February 7th at the First Baptist Church in

Moline from 9-2, I'll bring the dessert!

Here are the numbers for the end of 2017, we budget for 200 quilts a year and Jan-Dec we gave out 257 quilts. We logged 2528 hours. I logged 1036 miles in delivering quilts.

Phew!! So give yourselves a hand, I could not accomplish any of this without you. I am SO proud.

Here's some numbers that will blow you away: I took this position in May of 2012. We have given out 832 quilts since then and have logged 8846 hours. HOW AWESOME!

So much for a positon I was told would require 5 hours a month, you all lied to me, ha ha.

With the budgeted 200 quilts a year for 2018 here's the numbers: May 2018 --87 of the list, overfull November 2018--80 on the list -full Private deliveries: 20 as of now This leaves little room for error. This leaves little room for QOVF requests that I get every week.

So we are now booking for May 2019 and I have 20 on that list.

I feel overwhelmed and inadequate at times, but you all pull me thru it.

So thank you, thank you!

You are all amazing and greatly appreciated, so with a grateful heart, thank you.

DOLL QUILTS

Next meeting, 3rd Tuesday in February , 9-2, Deere Wiman carriage house.

I will bring fun stuff to plan for the next season, and hope some new members would have time to come and check us out. If you prefer to sew, bring a machine. I bring cutting board, rulers, iron, fabric, batting and chocolate! All donations welcome. I pass on what I can't use. There are a couple of boxes of smaller stuff needing to be cut for someone with ideas and who likes the small stuff!

Also an addition to our list of recipients: 58 quilts and 25+ color wheels to the Community Action Head Start program of Eastern Iowa. I am also making 20 'cot covers' for them for Valentine Day delivery. There is always a need for both, so these latter are about 24"x40", just 2 layers, preferable one side cozy, the other something you might not use in a quilt....I use some heavier cotton pieces for that. Must be totally washable. Just 'pillowcase and turn', close, and do a big X or a stitch line or 2 thru it to hold it together.

The doll quilts, about 24" square, or similar rectangle, but not much bigger.....some sort of fillerlight batting or flannel or a poly fabric you wouldn't use on the outside! Go easy on the quilting so they don't get too stiff.

The 2018 MVQG Quilt Show Challenge will focus on the theme of Sun, Moon, and/or Stars in a quilt piece. Traditional, modern, or art techniques can be employed. No size requirement. Quilt must tie in to any one, or two, or all three aspects of the theme.

TRAVEL COMMITTEE

We have finalized the plans for our trip to the International Quilt Study Center and Museum, Lincoln, NE on July 12-14, 2018. The International Quilt Study Center and Museum is the home of the largest known public collection of quilts in the world. Please visit <u>www.quiltstudy.org</u> for information on the collections being shown during our visit.

Anticipated cost for the trip is \$185.00 per person. The cost of meals is not included with the exception of those specifically stated. This includes travel via Tri-State Tours in their luxury bus. We will be leaving Tri-State, Davenport, at 7:00 a.m. on July 12 and returning Saturday evening. The cost also includes:

- Entrance to the museum
- Special behind the scenes tour and docent led gallery tour
- A catered lunch to be held at the museum
- Hotel accommodations, based on double occupancy, including a hot breakfast and free Wi-Fi

We are planning to stop in Winterset, IA on Thursday, home of John Wayne, Fons and Porter, Iowa Quilt Museum, covered bridges (Madison County) and A Pieceworks and Fons and Porter quilt shops.

Friday will be the museum and one or two quilt shops depending on our time.

Saturday before leaving Omaha, we hope to stop at The Country Sampler and then travel to Ames, stopping at The Quilt Connection (11,000 bolts of fabric).

We will begin taking reservations at the March Guild Meeting. \$100 deposit is required at the time of your reservation. The balance must be paid by the June Guild meeting.

March 6, 1 & 7 pm: Our very own national quilt judge, Carol Brooks, will speak about Quilt Design. She would like us to have quilts of all kinds from which to select to illustrate her presentation – small quilts, large quilts, wall hangings, traditional quilts, modern quilts, simple quilts, complex quilts, your best work, or even the ones on which you're certain you've made design miscalculations. Carol's presentation will be fast paced with lots of audience participation!

April 3: The April meeting features Charlotte Angottii, a nationally and internationally recognized quilt instructor who is known for her sense of humor, her way with color and design, and her laser-cut quilt kits that go together perfectly!

Charlotte's most popular class, "Let Me Surprise You," will be featured on Wednesday, April 4th from 9 to 3 at the Davenport Masonic Center. Charlotte will surprise us with a pre-cut quilt kit and will lead participants through the process of constructing the quilt especially designed for this workshop. Space is limited to 20 participants. <u>To hold your spot</u>, your check for \$135 (kit fee \$100, class fee \$35) is due on the day you sign up (no exceptions). Sign-up will be available at the February meeting. Sign-up for Charlotte's second class based on a "fan pattern" to be held on Thursday, April 5th, will also be available at the February meeting. In addition to the class fee, the Fan class requires purchasing a fan template (approximately \$15).
