let me know as soon as possible.

Another gentle reminder that some quilts are coming in too small, which if unfinished

we can add a border to correct them. If they are complete and too small,

I'll have to use them for my nursing home deliveries.

The new size is 60"x72" or pretty close to it.

They are trying to keep them uniform in size.

I also have 8 done and ready for private deliveries, weather, illness etc has delayed these getting done.

So hopefully soon.

DOLL QUILTS

On with the effort....we have so much new fabric and ideas...and need for cutters, sewers, planners. Deere Wiman Carriage House, 9-2, lots of room to spread out, for cutting, sorting and giving life to new ideas, and air to the boxes of fabric. I bring as many boxes as I think we may need (usually a lot more). And have lots of batting to be cut to 24" squares. One theme I am playing with, as I mentioned at guild, is to build in some. 'I spy' aspect to the quilt....matching blocks....animal, prints, food, or simply colors ...how many matches could one do...l have done some using different prints such as checks, dots, stars, stripes, plaid, paisley, hearts, animal, and a light space for writing their name. Some have a fun panel in the center...Whatever, we need more ideas, so at least come, check us out, and raid the fabric. Or take some of the kits. Or help put them together.....come, come, come.

Next meeting, 3rd Tuesday in March, 9-2, Deere Wiman carriage house.

I will bring fun stuff to plan for the next season, and hope some new members would have time to come and check us out. If you prefer to sew, bring a machine. I bring cutting board, rulers, iron, fabric, batting and chocolate! All donations welcome. I pass on what I can't use. There are a couple of boxes of smaller stuff needing to be cut for someone with ideas and who likes the small stuff!

The doll quilts, about 24" square, or similar rectangle, but not much bigger.....some sort of fillerlight batting or flannel or a poly fabric you wouldn't use on the outside! Go easy on the quilting so they don't get too stiff.

TRAVEL COMMITTEE

We have finalized the plans for our trip to the International Quilt Study Center and Museum, Lincoln, NE on July 12-14, 2018. The International Quilt Study Center and Museum is the home of the largest known public collection of quilts in the world. Please visit www.quiltstudy.org for information on the collections being shown during our visit.

Anticipated cost for the trip is \$185.00 per person. The cost of meals is not included with the exception of those specifically stated. This includes travel via Tri-State Tours in their luxury bus. We will be leaving Tri-State, Davenport, at 7:00 a.m. on July 12 and returning Saturday evening. The cost also includes:

- Entrance to the museum
- Special behind the scenes tour and docent led gallery tour
- A catered lunch to be held at the museum
- Hotel accommodations, based on double occupancy, including a hot breakfast and free Wi-Fi

We are planning to stop in Winterset, IA on Thursday, home of John Wayne, Iowa Quilt Museum, covered bridges (Madison County) and A Pieceworks quilt shop.

Friday will be the museum and one or two quilt shops depending on our time.

Saturday before leaving Omaha, we hope to stop at The Country Sampler and then travel to Ames, stopping at The Quilt Connection (11,000 bolts of fabric).

We will begin taking reservations at the March Guild Meeting. \$100 deposit is required at the time of your reservation. The balance must be paid by the June Guild meeting.
