


Have I told you lately how awesome you all are! During a pandemic you all have still continued to work! I am so proud of this amazing team. All of you make me look good.




QOV Mystery Quilt

Clue #2

Using 60 - 35/8" White squares, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each square. Match the right side of the white squares with 60 - 35/8" Red squares. Sew 1/4" on each side of the drawn line.

Cut on the drawn line and press the seam towards the Red half square triangle. Trim to 3" square. See diagrams below. Mark as number 3.






Clue #3

Using 78 - 35/8" White squares, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each square. Match the right side of the white squares with 78 - 35/8" Blue squares. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of the drawn line.

Cut on the drawn line and press the seam towards the Blue for 138 of the half square triangles. Press towards the White for the remainder of 18 half square triangles. Trim to 3" square. See diagrams below. Mark as number 4.
