Historical Interest

I want to thank the Program Committee for inviting me to share some of my collection. A huge thank you for the Holders and Folders. They work so hard and often don't get to see all the quilts.

A huge shout out to Rosie Baker. I'm sorry I forgot to let everyone know she made my tapestry Sun Bonnet Sue vest. The vest is even more special since it has my favorite color, green, and the purple that I wear a lot.

Reminder that you only have two more months to read. Reviews need to be placed in the Historical Interest folder in the President's box.

In the evening another Ruby Short McKim quilt was shown. "Colonial History Quilt" was published in 1927. (Ask someone from the evening meeting about Ruby Short McKim being a prolific designer.) This Redwork quilt has 24 blocks. Native Americans and others who were an important part of our History.

I was asked about the sheen on quilts. Many of us identify it as Polished Cotton. This shiny fabric was used a lot in Kit Quilts from the Depression years. (I had several dresses made from it when I was growing up.) http://www.textileglossary.com/terms/polished-cotton.html is a fun website that explains Polished Cotton is "A plain weave cotton cloth characterized by a sheen ranging from dull to bright, polish can be achieved either through the weave or the addition of a resin finish. Can be a solid color, usually piece dyed or printed. Is either a satin weave cotton or a plain weave cotton that is finished chemically to appear shiny. A cotton fabric with a luster. The luster may be due to the weave (often Satin), or from application of a calendered finish, or both. The degree of luster can be moderate or bright." (Calendering is "a mechanical finishing process for fabrics to produce special effects, such as high luster, glazing, moiré, and embossed effects. In this operation, the fabric is passed between heated rolls under pressure" (Source - Dictionary of Fibers & Textile Technology).

In the "American Quilts in the Industrial Age, 1760-1870." The International Quilt Study Center & Museum Collections. Copyright 2018. (A special Christmas present from my son. It is a hard cover and has 502 pages. I'm at page101 now.)

"these...colorful cotton fabrics were given a distinctive sheen by beetling. In which the cloth was beaten with clubs to flatten the yarns of the weave, making them more light reflective..." page 63

"wool cloth made from fine, long staple worsted fibers, then processed to enhance the sheen through the use of heat and pressure to glaze the top..." page 67.

President's Block


To honor Diana Engelbrecht for all the work she has done while being our president for 2 years (in September) I am requesting each member to make a quilt block. She has requested a signature block. The blocks will be due at the May meeting. I will put the blocks together, have it quilted and bind it.

The directions for the block is as follows:

- 1. Cut the background cream/ivory square 4 ¹/₂ inches.
- 2. Cut the 2 corner squares 3 ¹/₂ inches in your choice of fabric from your stash. The fabric should represent who you are. No holiday fabric please (example Easter eggs, pumpkins, scaredy cats, Christmas trees).
- 3. Mark a line through the middle of the corner squares diagonally from one corner to the other.
- 4. Line up on corner square in the corner of the background and sew along your marked line.
- 5. Press the triangle back. Please DO NOT trim.

Repeat 4 & 5 in the opposite corner.

Sign your block. We will have pens at the check-in desk at the guild meetings that you can use to sign if you don't have one. It is helpful to press a piece of freezer paper on back to stabilize it while you are signing



2020 MVQG CHALLENGE


Imagine the possibilities—no restrictions except the size 20 by 20. When combined with your creativity you're sure to enter a winner!

CAN YOU FILL A POSITION?

The board has 6 positions that need to be filled September 1. The nominating committee will be contacting people to fill those positions. Board members fill a 1-2 year term in the position they are elected. The maximum time a member can serve in each position is 2 years. Consider filling a position and contact Diana Engelbrecht or Faye Kunz to let us know you may be interested in a specific position. Filling a position is very rewarding. I have not spoken to anyone who has regretted doing so. The Board consist of the following offices.

<u>The President</u>: resides over the general and board meetings, develops the agendas for the meetings with the program chair, chooses the committee chairs that are vacant, compiles the volunteer half of the membership application and passes that list to the committee chairs, and sees each person as a quilt artist.

<u>The Vice President</u>: helps the President when needed, sets up the meeting dates at Butterwort Center, organizes the Presidents gift at the end of each year with one year being a quilt that she and others construct.

The Secretary: takes minutes at the general and board meetings.

The Treasurer: oversees the monies that come in and are paid out and keeps a count of the volunteer hours.

<u>The Program Chair</u>: along with a fabulous committee, contacts speakers that are local, regional, and national and contracts them for each meeting we have speakers at, organizes the potlucks, and contracts the programs 2 years out.


<u>The Newsletter Editor</u>: gathers information from committee chairs and board members and organizes it into the newsletter to pass on to each of you.

<u>The Historian</u>: goes to each event or group at least once throughout the year to take pictures, compile those pictures into a Shutterfly photo album, collect newspaper articles, directories, and any other items that would be historical to pass on to the generations to come.

<u>The Membership Chair</u>: keeps track of all members information as you join, checks you in so we have an accurate attendance record, and passes your volunteer half of your membership application to the president.

<u>Members at Large</u>: One is the immediate past president, the second one is one of you. They oversee the nametag drawing and help at the check in table at the general meetings.

<u>Webmaster</u>: updates the MVQG website, Facebook page, and Constant Contact list, sends mass emails, and checks the MVQG email account.

DEFINITIONS:

<u>Small Bed Quilt</u>: Lap to Full (up to 80" wide and proportionate in length)

Large Bed Quilt: Queen to King (over 80" wide and proportionate in length)

Solo: Constructed, stitched, and quilted by ONLY ONE PERSON.

Duet: Constructed, stitched, and quilted by TWO PERSONS.

<u>Group</u>: Constructed, stitched, and quilted by THREE OR MORE PERSONS

<u>Pieced</u>: Pieced by hand or machine. No other techniques (no embellishments, no applique, etc.) allowed. <u>All Hand Done</u>: Self-explanatory; only the binding stitched on by machine is allowed.

<u>Applied Techniques</u>: Any technique 'applied to the fabric' = Applique, painting, beading, crystals, etc., or any combination of these techniques with piecing is allowed.

Traditional: Pieces utilizing a traditional pieced/applique setting and/or pattern

Art: Original design pieces—no patterns or kits allowed.

Modern: May be pattern or kit. Must utilize 'modern' style in piecing and quilting design.

<u>Wall Quilts</u>: Designed to hang as art on a wall. These are quilted pieces that are NOT SUITED for use on a bed, crib, or sofa. These will not be bed quilts of any size that were made to be displayed on a wall.

Wall Quilts will be required to include a <u>short</u> (25 word) artist's statement listing the name of the designer and all techniques/methods used. (This should not include where/why the fabric was purchased, please.) Statements <u>may</u> be read aloud for the consideration of the judge. Category sizes may be adjusted as needed by committee.



Categories for 2020 Great River Quilt Show

1100- All Hand Made: Must be made entirely by hand with no machine sewing/quilting other than

Sewing the binding to the front of the quilt. All sizes, techniques, makers allowed.

- Small Bed Quilts: Used on a bed or crib; up to (and including) 80" wide and proportional in length.
 - 1110- Small Solo, Pieced: One person made top and quilted it. Only piecing allowed, no applique or embellishments of any kind will be allowed.
 - 1120- Small Solo, Applied Techniques: One person made top and quilted it. All applique, painting, embellishments, combination of techniques with piecing, etc. allowed, as well as entirely appliqued quilts, whole cloth quilts and those quilts without batting such as crazy quilts, wool quilts and cathedral windows.
 - 1130- Small Duet, Pieced: Two persons worked on any part of making the quilt. Only piecing allowed, no applique or embellishments of any kind will be allowed.
 - 1140- Small Duet, Applied Techniques: Two persons worked on any part of making the quilt. All applique, painting, embellishments, combination of techniques with piecing, etc. allowed, as well as entirely appliqued quilts, whole cloth quilts and those quilts without batting such as crazy quilts, wool quilts and cathedral windows.
- Large Bed Quilts: Used on a bed; wider than 80" and proportional in length.
 - 1210- Large Solo, Pieced: One person made top and quilted it. Only piecing allowed, no applique or embellishments of any kind will be allowed.
 - 1220- Large Solo, Applied Techniques: One person made top and quilted it. All applique, painting, embellishments, combination of techniques with piecing, etc. allowed, as well as entirely appliqued quilts, whole cloth quilts and those quilts without batting such as crazy quilts, wool quilts and cathedral windows.
 - 1230- Large Duet, Pieced: Two persons worked on any part of making the quilt. Only piecing allowed, no applique or embellishments of any kind will be allowed.
 - 1240- Large Duet, Applied Techniques: Two persons worked on any part of making the quilt. All applique, painting, embellishments, combination of techniques with piecing, etc. allowed, as well as entirely appliqued quilts, whole cloth quilts and those quilts without batting such as crazy quilts, wool quilts and cathedral windows.
 - 1300- Group Quilts: Quilts that have been made and/or quilted by **MORE** THAN TWO persons. All sizes, all techniques.
 - 1400- Miniature: Quilts will have all aspects of the quilt reduced in scale from a full-sized quilt. Maximum size is 24" x 24". All techniques, all makers.

- **1500- Modern**: Quilt must reflect some of the following characteristics: Asymmetry of design, improvisational piecing, bold colors, on-trend color combinations, and graphic prints, use of negative space, unconventional block structures, or reinterpreted traditional blocks. Quilting designs should reiterate modern theme. All sizes, techniques and makers allowed.
- WALL Quilts- Categories may be tweaked to balance numbers of entries.

1610-Wall Small- Quilts will be under 35" wide.

- A. Traditional: Traditional pieced/applique setting, patterns and kits allowed.
- B. Art: Must be original design; no commercial patterns or kits allowed

1620-Wall Medium- Quilts will be 35" or more in width but less than 55" wide.

- A. Traditional: Traditional pieced/applique setting, patterns and kits allowed.
- B. Art: Must be original design; no commercial patterns or kits allowed

1630- Wall Large- Quilts will be 55" or more in width.

- A. Traditional: Traditional pieced/applique setting, patterns and kits allowed.
- B. Art: Must be original design; no commercial patterns or kits allowed.
- 1700-Found and Finished: Quilts will include all sizes, all techniques. Quilts will have been started by another quilter (known or unknown) and finished by entrant(s).
- 1800-3-D: Category will include all three-dimensional projects to include such items as tuffets, dolls and more. Use your imagination. Must be able to be easily moved and displayed without issues. Need not be quilted, but may include quilted pieces. All techniques, all makers.

Wearables: Items do not need to be quilted. All techniques, all makers.

1910-Garments: Articles of clothing (vests, jackets, etc.) Pattern designer required on entry form

1920- Bags/Purses/Accessories

- **2000- Miscellaneous**: Any entry that does not fit into any other category and items such as household items. Examples: table runners, placemats, etc. All techniques, all makers.
- 2100-MVQG Quilt Show Challenge: All techniques. No size requirement. Traditional, modern, or art techniques can be employed. Quilt must tie into any one, two or three aspects of the theme.
- **2200-All Other Challenges:** All challenge quilts **made after August 2018.** Any guild/sit and sew group. Entrant must be member of MVQG at time of entry. All techniques, all makers, all sizes.
- **2300- Junior:** Entrant must be under the age of 18 and be a child/grandchild of a member. Each entry will receive a participation ribbon. **Non-judged category**.
