





Creating an account is similar to what occurs when visiting an online shopping Website (e.g. Amazon) or when subscribing to receive an organization's newsletter or emails. The Webmaster will make the Webpages listed above private and grant all current members access to the Webpages. After the Webmaster publishes the private Webpages, the first time a member accesses one of the private pages, he/she will be prompted to login or create an account (similar to the images below), which means providing an email and password of their choosing.

It is time to safeguard the Guild's, and its members', information. While the MVQG is a quilt resource for non-members and the general public, some information provided on the Website is intended for members only.

Historical Interest



The 2020 Uncoverings from the American Quilt Study Group is now in the library.

The cover is a picture of the Solar System quilt made Ellen Harding Baker who lived in eastern Iowa, one time in Lone Tree.

The quilt is now stored in the Smithsonian. Ellen used the quilt for lectures. Article was written by Mary Bywater Cross, who lived in Iowa City. (She was the first professional quilter I met. She gave me a flier on her lectures in 1983!)

"Unraveling the Mysteries of a White Quilt," by Linda Baumgarten, Gretchen Guidess and Kimberly Ivey. The quilt from the Williamsburg collection is a white stuffed work. The most wonderful thing about the paper is the line drawings of the quilting design. WOW! One doesn't need to read the paper just drool over the stitching!

Are quilters sane? We cut up big pieces of fabric and then sew it back together....Another paper is "Noting Thou Love be Lost or Die: An 1846 Friendship Quilt made at the Vermont Asylum for the Insane". Two quilts are pictured, The Album Quilt and a beautiful Baltimore Album.

"For Top-Cover Warmth" North Country Comforters 1800-1970s by Hallie E. Bond. Ms Bond's paper is about the tied comforters she researched. My bedroom was in the NW corner on the second floor. And in the winter it was cold!!! My bed had many tied quilts, sometimes so many it was hard to roll over. Bond's thesis: Aren't these quilt important? For me, yes, tied comforters kept me warm.

The last paper is "Reach Out and Touch Someone." Examining How Instagram Has Become a Conduit for Quiltmaking Communities. Deanna Allred and Rosa Thornley are folklorist....to the study of expressive culture, our methodology section gives insight into the challenges faced by digital folklorists due to the ephemeral nature of emergent technologies. Have a read.



QOV Mystery Quilt

OV Mystery Quilt Clue #8


For this clue you will use the blocks marked 5,

6 and 7. Assemble them to look like the below. Make 30. They should measure 10.5" square.



QOV Mystery Quilt Clue # 10


Using the 4 blocks you made in Clue #1 and marked as 2 and the 2" White and Blue strips you cut, assemble the borders as shown below. Because of the corner squares you can assemble the three strips before attaching them to the middle. The final quilt should measure 59.5" by 79.5". Hope you enjoyed this mystery!



QOV Mystery Quilt Clue #9

This is my design of the middle of the quilt. But I **challenge you** to arrange the blocks differently. You need 5 blocks wide and 7 lengthwise. They are each 10.5 inches so when complete the middle of the quilt should measure 50.5 x 70.5.

So have some fun with your design wall!



Note: the 24 2.5" blue squares are not needed. It appears I had a senor moment when I wrote that. I sincerely apologize for the error.


