
More blocks are needed for the President's Quilt. Due to the cancellation of our meetings, members have not been able to turn in blocks.

The Original President's Message

Mississippi Valley Quilters Guild has an extensive library of more than 900 books. If you are trying to learn a technique, find a pattern that you would like to try out, read about history, and other wonderful reads, we probably have a book to fit the need.

If you know the name of a book or the author/designer that has written a book you are interested in, all you have to do is email Sandie Cockerill at mike-sandie@att.net or Mary Wilke at mary22711@aol.com. They will bring it to the next meeting if you give them a couple days lead time to go to the storage unit to pull it.

The library is usually set up on the far wall in the L (near the kitchen). There are a few meetings they do not set up. They bring an assortment of approximately 75 books to each meeting.

You check each book out for 2 months with the opportunity to renew it a number of times to be able to finish your project. If you do not renew the book there is a \$.25 per month over due fee.

Enjoy browsing through them during break or before and after the meetings. If meetings continue to be cancelled and there is something you are interested in, email Sandie or Mary and they will make arrangements to safely get the book to you.

2020 MVQG CHALLENGE

The theme for the 2020 MVQG Challenge is Double 2020. There is a \$1.00 fee per challenge entry. Quilts must be 20" by 20." Bring your challenge to the September 2020 meeting. They will be displayed and voted on at the meeting that night. Top three vote getters will win a prize valued at \$25 first place, \$15 second place, and \$10 third place.

Incorporate "double" into your quilt theme—anything duplicated, such as twins, double dutch, double vision, double negative, double down (maybe including feathers?), double play, double trouble, double chocolate, double cheese, etc.

Imagine the possibilities—no restrictions except the size 20 by 20. When combined with your creativity you're sure to enter a winner!

Quilt Show News: QUILT SHOW CANCELLED

After much deliberation and consideration of the current situation by the Quilt Show Committee and the Board of Directors, the 2020 Great River Quilt Show scheduled for September has been cancelled.

Sadly, this was not a difficult decision to make at this time. Health and financial concerns make this is the most prudent path to follow. At the Quilt Show, the safety of our guests, vendors, and members is our first priority. A majority of our guests and volunteers are over 60 and considered to be more vulnerable to COVID-19. We believe that social distancing restrictions for public gatherings will still be required by Fall, making it very difficult to set up, man, and run the show. These restrictions and concerns will also limit the numbers of visitors to the show.

The inability to hold meetings, collect for second hand treasures, sell raffle tickets, and contact merchants for raffle basket donations has greatly impacted the show. Fewer vendors and sponsors also result in less income to offset show expenses. Members who are in these higher risk groups have expressed reluctance to volunteer at the show. All of these factors have impacted our ability to present the quality show that our members and guests expect. The funds usually spent to put on the show must be safeguarded for use in running the guild until the 2022 show. The fairgrounds is allowing us to advance our deposit to the 2022 show.

The raffle for the quilt show raffle quilt will be held as scheduled on September 22, 2020.

PLEASE CONTINUE TO SELL RAFFLE TICKETS. You may contact Dawn Thompson for additional tickets and to turn in money from ticket sales. Raffle ticket sales, garage sales of second hand treasure items, and other money-making events as determined by the Board of Directors, will be scheduled to support the MVQG through this extraordinary time period.

The Quilt Show Committee appreciates the members of the MVQG who have items to donate to Second Hand Treasures and for the Charity Auction, sold raffle tickets, and made and are making quilts for the show. Please stay safe and quilt on! Be sure to label your quilts as they are completed in anticipation of the 2022 show, which will be bigger and better than ever!
