She machine pieces her quilts and hand quilts all her creations. It takes her about two weeks to hand quilt the quilts once she has it on the frame. When she worked as a beautician she gave her clients quilts, and has donated to numerous fund raisers through out the years. She currently has around 50 at her home, including 12 for Christmas gifts.

> "Wings and Wedges" Saturday, October 31/Sunday, November 1 *. \$70 In a fabric collage of simple symmetrical shapes, you will learn the basics of Jane's accessible machine applique techniques. Jane will quide you in creating your own unique collage composition. You will also be given the chance to sharpen your design and machine embroidery skills. Sewing machine needed.

"Moths and Moons" Monday, November 2 *. \$35

In this one-day class, each student will get a pattern and directions for making the "Moths and Moons" quilt. \$18. Bring your favorite fabrics or purchase a kit from Jane's stash of FreeSpirit fabrics to create one or up to three giant moths (approximately 27" W X 21"H, each). Jane's accessible applique method will be used to assemble the moths. After class you will stitch your background and apply your gorgeous winged creatures. Sewing machine needed (and at least a few decorative stitches). 

DOUBLE DOUBLE QUILT CHALLENGE DELAYED

President Diana Englebrecht informed me that the Board has extended the deadline for the Double Double Challenge to the December meeting. It will not be on the upcoming September meeting agenda.



Considerations included that with Covid-19 there hasn't been sufficient meetings to promote the challenge and allow for sign ups, and secondly, that many were busy with sewing necessary masks.

For those of you who have completed your challenge entry, I apologize for the delay and look forward to seeing your entry in December.

The theme for the 2020 MVQG Challenge is Double 2020. There is a \$1.00 fee per challenge entry. Quilts must be 20" by 20." Bring your challenge to the December 2020 meeting. They will be displayed and voted on at the meeting that night. Top three vote getters will win a prize valued at \$25 first place, \$15 second place, and \$10 third place.

It Takes a Village

Due September 1, 2020 General Meeting

Thank you for participating in the special display we are gathering to exhibit in area galleries and other venues through the next 2 years. Final display planned to be the Special Display for the 2022 Great River Quilt Show.

If you are interested and haven't picked up your sky for \$1, contact Diana for it. We can add new people in as needed, but we encourage everyone who has their sky to please bring your piece to the September meeting. We need to know a number so we can let venues know how much room we need.

Your piece should measure 16x16 with some allowance for shrinkage when quilted. It should extend to the edge (no bindings or anything that would frame it in). They will be lined up next to each other connecting the horizons from one to the next for a continuous masterpiece.

The subject can be anything in a village, such as buildings (schools, churches, homes, library, art gallery, movie theater, eateries, hot dog stands) ball park, amusement park, bridges or parks. It doesn't have to be a real building or scene. It can be a local scene, childhood scene, or just one from your imagination. It can be any season.

Ways to finish your It Takes A Village wall quilt

You have several options.

- 1. You can pillowcase the sandwich like the doll quilts are done. Then quilt.
- 2. You can sandwich, quilt and then finish the edges.
 - a. zigzag the edge.
 - b. do a facing edge. If you Google facing a quilt tutorial, there are many videos that come up.
- c. using a single thickness of tulle (netting) wrapped around the edge as a binding leaves a nice finish and doesn't frame it.

The label should include The It Takes A Village Exhibit, your name and date, If a pattern was used, the name and designer of the pattern. Optional: your inspiration,
