The meeting was called to order by President Diana Engelbrecht at 7:00pm.

President Diana Engelbrecht welcomed members and asked each to greet the person on their left and ask the question, "What do you like most about September?"

Announcements:

Board & Committee Reports:

Audit Report: The Audit was conducted and completed by Nancy Jacobson and everything was fine.

Doll Quilts: Margaret Paulos announced that Head Start was cutting down their classroom size. Doll quilts are still needed. She asked if anyone knew of agencies needing Doll Quilts to please let her know.

Program:

Mary Korrect announced the October meeting speakers will be herself and her sister, Jan Ragaller. They will introduce and launch "Border of the Quarter" and will include a trunk show. In preparation for the Border Sew-A-Long, Mary suggested reading up on border and medallion quilts. She suggested when making the center block to use many colors, and the size should be divisible evenly (2/4/5). The bigger the center block, the bigger the quilt. Center blocks can be square, circle, hexagon, and rectangle.

Mary recently talked with Jane Sassaman, the November program speaker. Jane is hopeful she will be able to attend the meeting and instruction, but is cautious about Covid. The Program Committee will continue with signups for Jane's class through the October meeting. A hard call will be made in October to determine if Jane will come.

There will be a Program Committee meeting via Zoom on Wednesday. Details will follow.

Mary also announced the Double Challenge will be due in December. The cost is \$1.00.

The September event will replace the November Ceremony. The July Drive-through went well. All the Veterans were very complimentary. He is asking Guild members for a topic for the display and would like to feature the quilts that were to be in the 2020 Quilt Show. A possible "Mini 2020 Quilt Show" could be displayed. Raffle Quilt: Dawn Thompson asked members to turn in their raffle tickets and money ASAP. Dawn has been visiting Quilt shops and will be visiting the Cedar Rapids Country Inn & Suites for a display by Rainbows and Calico on Thursday. They have offered to let Dawn sell tickets for the Raffle Quilt. Dawn encouraged members to keep selling tickets.

Second-Hand Treasures: Faye Kunz announced that tickets will also be sold at the two Garage Sales on September 18-19. Ticket sales will close at noon on September 19. The drawing will be held via a Facebook Live presentation from Faye's Garage Sale at 2:00 p.m. on September 19th. At this time, the pre-sales have brought in over \$1,000.
