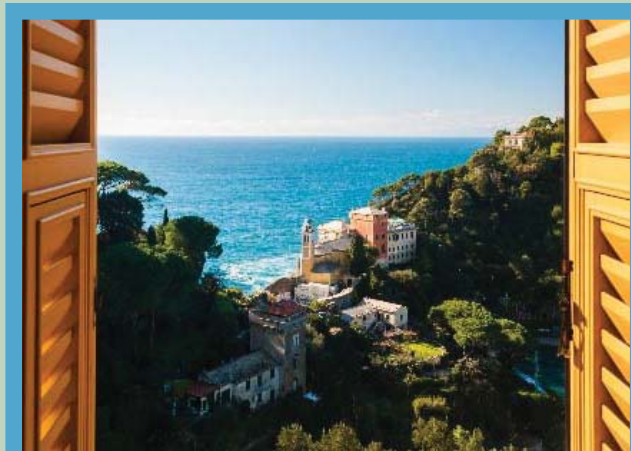

Historical Interest

It dawned on me that I've only written about dead people. Which means I have to write about my most famous alivest quilt historian. She was inducted into the Quilter's Hall of Fame in 2001. I have copies of her 2 most important books Encyclopedia of Pieced Quilt Patterns (I have all 3 editions) & Clues in the Calico. I didn't get to meet her until The Iowa Quilt Guild in Fort Dodge where I took her "How to Make New Quilts Look Old" class. (Gee one of my best days ever! Meeting Barbara and seeing my first Featherweight).

She is one of the most curious people I know! Her quilt history exploration started when she was taking an Art class at University of Kansas at the Spencer Museum. The Carrie Hall "Quilt Block Collection" was in drawers. Barbara then began her search of where the block designs came from.

I took her appraisal class in Lawrence, KS. It was wonderful. I got to stay in her home. Nothing matched, furniture, dishes, flatware and she even had knitting. Her bathroom was black with white polka dots--with a picture of her and her sister with a Dalmation. Besides quilting books she has written about Cowgirl Boots and Dogs. It is almost impossible to have ALL her books she has written so many. In addition she has been designing fabric for MODA. (That's where I learned about Wm. Morris.)

In conclusion Barbara Brackman is the bestest quilt historian ever.
