October Program



Our featured speaker, Linda Halpin, is a graduate of the Embroiderers' Guild of America's Teacher Certification Program in Quiltmaking. The intensive two year examination program tests not only the candidates' stitching skills but also their knowledge of color and design, history of their chosen field, and classroom abilities. She is one of only a handful of instructors nationwide who has been certified by the Embroiderer's Guild of America (EGA) as an Instructor in Quiltmaking. Actively teaching quiltmaking across the United States and Canada for over 40 years, Linda has been a member of the teaching faculty of several distinguished conferences nationwide (including the AQS show in Paducah), as well as worked with guilds of memberships

ranging from 25 to 400. In addition to teaching, Linda has written seven quiltmaking books ranging from quilt history, three dimensional applique, and quilted clothing, to scrap quilts, and patterns inspired by the Little House on the Prairie books. She also served as Chairman of both EGA's National Master Craftsman Program for Quiltmaking and Teacher Certification Programs. She has curated numerous quilt exhibits, as well as been involved as a judge at regional exhibits, and participated in an Exhibit Judging Forum which established guidelines now used nationwide.

Linda will present two different trunk shows at our meetings on October 1: "Borders on Parade" at the afternoon meeting and "1 x 1: Quilts Using 1 x 1 Half Square Triangles" in the evening. Additionally, she will teach two classes for our Guild - Prairie Lilies on Oct 2 and Mexican Cross on Oct 3. Both classes will be held at the Kaaba Shriners Building - 511 Veterans Memorial Parkway in Davenport. Lunch will be available on site for \$5.

October 1: Our featured speaker, Linda Halpin, will present two trunk shows: "Borders on Parade" at the afternoon meeting and "1 x 1: Quilts Using 1 x 1 Half Square Triangles" in the evening.

Linda will also teach two classes for our Guild - Prairie Lilies and Mexican Cross. 10/2: Prairie Lilies: Applique combines with piecing in this one day workshop. Joyous colors combine to create Prairie Lilies, constructed in my two-for-one technique. Piecing in this method creates cutaways that are ready to go into a <u>bonus</u> quilt, so you are actually making two quilts at the same time. Make use of every bit of fabric. It is such fun! Students start with how to choose and combine fabrics for a quilt, giving valuable fabric selection skills that can apply to your future quilt-making. This is followed with Halpin's two-for-one piecing method, then adorn with applique, utilizing a very nifty stem technique. In addition to the Prairie Lilies quilt, students will also be making a bonus quilt out of the cutaways.

10/3: Mexican Cross: Cheery colors pop in this fun version of Mexican Cross. Not only is it a great pattern for using up lots of different fabrics in one quilt, but the construction technique cleverly creates a bonus quilt out of the cutaways. This complex looking pattern is a snap when you make it with Halpin's shortcut techniques.

Both classes will be held at the Kaaba Shriners Building - 511 Veterans Memorial Parkway in Davenport. Lunch will be available on site for \$5



November 5: The program at our November meeting will feature a panel of Long-Arm Quilters coordinated by Terre Klipsch discussing "Everything You Wanted To Know From Your Longarmer, but were Afraid to Ask."





There are three more wonderful books in the library.

Blocks and Borders by Jenny Beyer. 40 years ago Jinny's Quilt "Ray of Light" won the Good Housekeeping contest. And the world of quilting was changed. She used fabric with color on color designs. Then she wrote the book on how she designed her quilts. Take a read



Crazy Quilts by Penny McMorris: Penny hosted two of the first quilt shows on Public Television in the 80's. The book has some of the most fantastic Crazy Quilts every stitched! Take a read and be awed with the embroidery designs. The answer to last month's question: Can a quilt history book without patterns sell? The Answer is YES. This book belongs on the coffee table of everyone who embroiders or not. Again be inspired.

I saved the best for last. Quilted Gardens: Floral Quilts of the Nineteenth Century by Ricky Clark. Ricky was a part of the Ohio Quilt Research Project. For the book she selected the most wonderful quilts (and having my nose close to Baltimore Album Quilts, many of the quilts in the book are better! Pot of Flower quilts (AKA Pride of Iowa) on pages 46 & 47 and Currants and Coxcombs, (page 31) with its hundreds of currants are terrific.

QUILT SHOW RULES

Only members of the MVQG can enter a quilt in the Quilt Show, judging is optional.

To enter a quilt the entrant must be a member in good standing of the MVQG the year of the show and the previous year (due to registration deadlines).


To enter a quilt in the show, the entrant must have participated in the construction of the quilt, e.g. piecing, applique, or quilting.

In a duet category, only members will be eligible to receive a ribbon.

Winners in a non-duet category receive one category ribbon.

Special exhibits, e.g. gravel road, river, QOV, not judged but entered under one member's name can include quilts from non-members. The quilt show committee will determine what special exhibits will be included in each show.



Well as I type this it is on the eve of 9-11. This time of year always makes me reflect what happened on that day. We as a nation came together. We were Americans who cared once again for each other. I miss the day of 9-12 when we loved each other beyond words. So it's been 18 years and I hope we never forget! It's because of that tragic day we are Quilts of Valor. For those who don't know how it came about here goes: In 2003 a nurse whose son came back from Afghanistan with the demons of war was wrapped in a quilt by her. She saw the demons leaving him. So she thought that if it helped him why not other returning military. So since the inception of QOV nationwide we have given 228,000 guilts and 11,000 volunteers. There is a chapter in Canada and Australia. So it's going beyond our borders. We locally have 60+ who work with me. Since I started in May of 2012, locally we have given 1,214 as of yesterday. I am so proud of each and every one of you. I am proud to call you all a friend. I couldn't be more blessed. I truly want to thank all of you for stepping up and meeting all our goals. We average 250 quilts a year. You are all unbelievable and my gratitude goes out to all.

So November 3rd is coming quickly. The award ceremony is at the Botanical Center in Rock Island. Times: 12:30 and 2:30. We have 93 vets invited. If you want to be blessed come see what we do.
