October 2: The October program features award winning Quilt Show quilts.

November 6:



Our speaker in November is Sue Rasmussen, an experienced speaker and instructor who is sought after by Guilds, festivals, and retreat centers around the world. Sue has degrees in Textile Sciences and Agricultural Economics from University of California, Davis and has produced an extensive and varied body of work, including hundreds of quilts, quilt art and quilted clothing, many of which are nationally exhibited.

Our Guild meetings will feature two different presentations – “A Desperate Housewife’s Quilt Journey in the afternoon and “The Ins and Outs of Sewing Machine Needles and Thread” in the evening. She will provide instruction for two classes:

Sunday, November 4: “Landscapes/Pictorial Quilts” – Curved Machine Pieced --This class is an introduction to the curved machine piecing technique for landscape and pictorial quilts. In this class students will cover design techniques, fabric choices, marking, sewing and pattern development working directly with fabric. To simplify and allow more time for learning these techniques, Sue has designed a simple landscape pattern (22” by 28”) of a Single Tree Landscape, to be used by students in this class. By utilizing this pattern, students will immediately begin learning the process of working on landscape quilts without taking hours to design an individual piece. (\$12 pattern fee, payable to the instructor)

Monday, November 5: “Curved Paper Pieced Flying Geese” – In this class, students move beyond basic paper pieced geese by adding a dramatic twist to them and design a small quilt (18” by 24”) with curved flying geese. Students will learn how to design, draw, measure, and sew the pattern in class. Sue will discuss in detail many of the options available for using curved flying geese as borders or central design elements. Sue shares many secret tricks to paper piecing. This class is fun! It will open up new horizons to curved paper foundation piecing.

Sign-up sheets will continue at the October Guild meeting. The class enrollment fee for MVQG members is \$35. Waiting lists will be established, when enrollment reaches the maximum number of students.

Both classes will be held at the Kaaba Shriners Building - 511 Veterans Memorial Parkway in Davenport. Lunch will be available on site for \$5.

Resources for Bolstering Your Paper Piecing Skills: We’ve learned that a number of Guild members have indicated that they want to review the basics of paper piecing prior to the Workshop on November 6th and others have expressed interest discovering what’s involved in paper piecing. To provide timely assistance, Guild members with paper piecing skills will be available and ready to assist you at the October meetings of the GetAway, Quilt Queens, and PinPals.

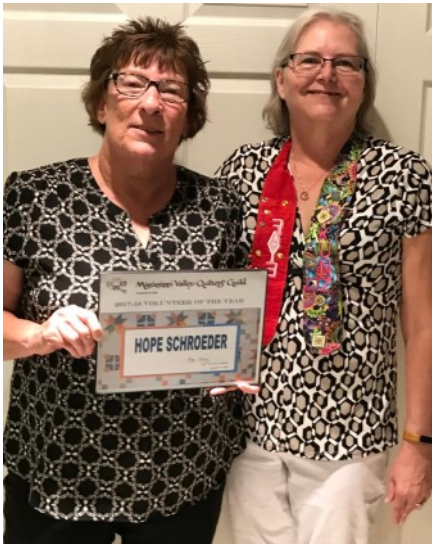

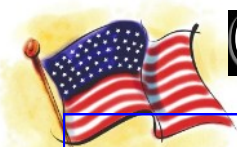
