Doll Quilts. Margaret Paulos has been sorting the fabric in doll quilt shed and has some items she found that are not suitable for doll quilts that she is giving away. Margaret indicated the doll quilt numbers are doing well. She asked if anyone knows of programs where they are in need of doll quilts to let her know.

Treasurer's Report. Laura Strickland reported on the 2020-2021 Budget, which was approved by the Board. Since the Guild did not have a quilt show this year and membership decreased by 33%, to be fiscally responsible, the Board made budget cuts. For committee chairs, your budget for this year is approximately half of last year's budget. To maintain the Quilt Guild for the long term, we needed to make those decisions. If additional money comes in, the Board may then be able to allocate funds to committee chairs (as necessary). Laura also introduced a new procedure regarding money donations by members. There is now a pink form to fill out for committee chairs. If in support of committee activity, you have generously purchased something but have not asked to be reimbursed for the item(s), please inform the committee chair. The reason we need to know this is as we budget for the next year, if overages occur, we know to allocate those dollars into the program for next year. The other two forms remain: blue for deposits and yellow for reimbursements. The pink form may be available on the Website.

Webmaster. Shelly Moore reported on the website. She has received the most updated membership list and imported to Constant contact. The website is changing and if you have any suggestions, please let Shelly know. Faye has generously provided the subscription to Zoom for this year's meetings. We are researching costs of video conferencing subscriptions and devices needed. As we research video conferencing, we ask for your patience as we continue to learn. Her bio reads: "After a varied career in the design world, Jane began to quilt in 1980. She found that these "soft paintings" satisfied the draftsman, the craftsman and the artist in her. Consequently, she is now a dedicated quilt artist and fabric designer. Her art quilts have been shown in many national and international exhibits, including Quilt National 1989 through 2005 and Contemporary American Quilts, the first major exhibit of American art quilts in England. Her quilt "Willow" was named as One of the One Hundred Best American Quilts of the Century. Jane is also the author of "The Quilted Garden". The book includes twenty years of her work and exercises for making nature-inspired quilts. Designing for Free Spirit fabrics." Jane's program was very inspiring.
