# QUILT APPRAISER—CHRIS MOLINE

Chris Moline is an AQS certified appraiser of quilted textiles, an assistant to the AQS Appraiser Certification Committee and an experienced restorer. Chris has been an avid quilter for more years than she willingly admits and has produced award winning quilts. Additionally, her knowledge of quilting and fabric history is quite extensive. Her quilt collection spans a variety of techniques, styles, and experiences. She presents several lectures and workshops designed to inspire quilters to learn more about quilts and quilting, stretch their creative ability, experiment with traditional as well as contemporary styles and techniques, and improve their productivity.

Chris will be appraising quilts from noon Thursday, September 20 through Saturday, September 22 at a fee of \$55 per appraisal.

- 1. To determine insurance value, fair market value, or donation value.
- 2. To determine values to settle estates or the division of property as in a divorce.
- 3. To determine replacement value (insurance) when a show requires an appraisal.
- 4. To accompany a gift.
- 5. Curiosity.

## Featured Quilter 2020 Beulah Spaulding

Beulah was a sewer since she was big enough to reach the treadle. As her children were growing up, she would make their clothes as well as some of her own. She has always had a creative side. To keep busy she would do hand embroidery of States, State birds, flowers, and then one day her mom said that would look great as a quilt. This started her on her quilting journey. Interesting, Beulah did not know her mother quilted until she started quilting. The year was 1977.

She does all her quilting on a frame made by her grandfather for her grandmother. He made it from left over wood and sawhorses.

When asked how many quilts she has made, she can't say. She does have 60 at her house right now. She has given away more than she can remember. She has made them for her children, her grandchildren. Beulah has given away many for charity as well. Once her sister asked her for a quilt for a charity raffle and it raised \$1400.

## Featured Quilter 2022 Gloria Kloos

Gloria has been a sewer all her life and quilting since around 1983. One of her first quilts was one she made for her son as he was going off to college. It was in Illinois States colors of orange and blue in a double Irish Ring pattern.

Her sister got her engaged when she asked Gloria to take a class at a quilt store that was up on 43<sup>rd</sup> Avenue in Moline.

Gloria loves color and needs the design to speak to her. She worked on this year's raffle quilt. She is drawn to unique patterns and fabric. Gloria loves the thrill of a new pattern. She is liking Kaffe Fassat and string quilting right now.

Gloria feels that it is quite an honor to be the 2022 featured quilter. But she feels that there are many deserving quilters in the guild. She has helped with Quilt Get-A-Way, Second Hand Treasures and worked on the Block to Raffle. Gloria loves the social aspect of getting together with likeminded quilters and seeing what others are doing.

## Meet your judges for the 2022 Great River Quilt Show

Sue Cortese (pronounced Cor-tease) grew up in Buffalo, NY. She is a quilter, fabric dyer, teacher, vendor, long arm quilter and a Certified Judge. She started quilting 1995 (dyeing fabric shortly afterwards) when living in Green River, WY. Her curiosity in judging and what makes a winning quilt began after she helped with the first "Quilting on the Green" quilt show. Moving to Holland, MI in 1998, she became an active member West Michigan Quilt Guild. That led to part-time job at a quilt shop, cutting fabric and teaching. Teaching fabric dyeing snowballed into selling hand-dyed fabric, starting her own company (SELC Fabrics LLC), and vending at quilt shows.

Initially Sue planned to make a quilt in every style and/or pattern. This quest led her to taking a lot of classes and learning many different techniques. She enjoys hand quilting as well as machine quilting, applique as well as piecing, ...there is room to love it all. She sees judging as another way to encourage quilters, as well as promoting the art of quilting. She has been honored with an invitation for traveling exhibition curator by Nancy Crow, placing 2 nd in the AQS Paducah Show, amongst others.

**Linda M. Scholten** is a guilter and guilt judge who has been quilting since 1975. Since her certification as a quilt judge in 1984, she has judged many shows, ranging from very small local shows to large national shows, judging many of the shows several times each. She has served in several different capacities in the local, regional and national guilt organizations of which she has been a member. Her guilts and wall hangings range from traditional to art guilt, in no particular order—she enjoys the freedom to react with cloth as the moment and her inspiration demand. Her works have been shown internationally; she has won several contests and ribbons for her guilt making. Her works have been published in several books and publications, and her guilt "Garden Party" has been chosen to be printed in the 2023 Ouilt Art Engagement Calendar. Other interests include collecting and repairing vintage and antique sewing machines (particularly Singers), repairing sewing machines, beading, and enjoying life with her husband and Perdita, her black cat.

# Why Hire a Certified Quilt Show Judge?

# Breadth of Knowledge

Certified Judges study art, design, and quilting styles and techniques, as well as quilt history so they can bring a well-rounded knowledge base to the judging table. They work hard to stay informed of all the current trends in the quilting world, while never losing sight of the rich heritage of the art.

## Specific, Constructive Feedback

Certified Judges provide specific, objective feedback to entrants. They follow a systematic protocol for a complete survey of each quilt. Their comments focus on both the aspects of the quilts that are done well and those that could be improved. Their goal is to help entrants gain confidence in their skills as well as to consider how to strengthen the quality of their future work.

#### **Ethical and Professional**

Certified Judges adhere to the NACQJ code of ethics and exhibit a high degree of professionalism in their work.

# Categories for 2022 Great River Quilt Show

# **DEFINITIONS:**

- <u>Small Bed Quilt</u>: Crib, Lap, and Full (up to 75" wide and proportionate in length)
- <u>Large Bed Quilt</u>: Queen to King (over 75" wide and proportionate in length)
- <u>Solo</u>: Constructed, stitched, and quilted by ONLY ONE PERSON.
- <u>Duet</u>: Constructed, stitched, and quilted by TWO PERSONS.
- Group: Constructed, stitched, and quilted by THREE OR MORE PERSONS
- <u>Pieced</u>: Pieced by hand or machine. No other techniques (no embellishments, no applique, etc.) allowed.
- <u>All Hand Done</u>: Self-explanatory; only the binding stitched on by machine is allowed.
- Applied Techniques: Any technique 'applied to the fabric'=
   Applique, painting, beading, crystals, etc., or any combination of these techniques with piecing is allowed.
- <u>Art</u>: Original designs only—no patterns or kits allowed.
   Quilts will be required to include a <u>short</u> (25 word) artist's statement listing all techniques/methods used. (This should not include where/why the fabric was purchased, please.) Statements <u>may</u> be read aloud for the consideration of the judge.
- Modern: May be pattern or kit. Must utilize 'modern' style in piecing and quilting design.

• Wall Quilts: Designed to hang on a wall. These are quilted pieces that are NOT SUITED for use on a bed, crib, or sofa.

# **CATEGORIES/ITEMS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR BEST OF SHOW:**

- 1700-Found and Finished
- 1800-3-Dimensional
- 1910-Garments
- 1920-Bags, Purses, Accessories
- 2000-Miscellaneous
- 2100, 2200- All Challenges
- 2300-Junior (Non-judged)

#### ALL OTHER CATEGORIES ARE ELIGIBLE FOR BEST OF SHOW.

**1100- All Hand Made:** Must be made entirely by hand with no machine sewing/quilting other than sewing the binding to the front of the quilt. All sizes, techniques, makers allowed.

**Small Bed Quilts**: Used on a bed, crib, or sofa. Quilts up to (and including) 75" wide and proportional in length.

**1110- Small Solo, Pieced:** One person made top and quilted it. **Only** piecing allowed, no applique or embellishments of any kind will be allowed.

**1120- Small Solo, Applied Techniques**: One person made top and quilted it. All applique, painting, embellishments, combination of techniques with piecing, etc. allowed, as well as entirely appliqued quilts, whole cloth quilts and those quilts without batting such as crazy quilts, wool quilts and cathedral windows.

- **1130- Small Duet, Pieced:** Two persons worked on any part of making the quilt. **Only** piecing allowed, no applique or embellishments of any kind will be allowed.
- **1140- Small Duet, Applied Techniques:** Two persons worked on any part of making the quilt. All applique, painting, embellishments, combination of techniques with piecing, etc. allowed, as well as entirely appliqued quilts, whole cloth quilts and those quilts without batting such as crazy quilts, wool quilts and cathedral windows.

**Large Bed Quilts**: Used on a bed. Quilts wider than 75" and proportional in length.

- **1210- Large Solo, Pieced:** One person made top and quilted it. **Only** piecing allowed, no applique or embellishments of any kind will be allowed.
- **1220- Large Solo, Applied Techniques:** One person made top and quilted it. All applique, painting, embellishments, combination of techniques with piecing, etc. allowed, as well as entirely appliqued quilts, whole cloth quilts and those quilts without batting such as crazy quilts, wool quilts and cathedral windows.
- **1230- Large Duet, Pieced:** Two persons worked on any part of making the quilt. **Only** piecing allowed, no applique or embellishments of any kind will be allowed.
- **1240-** Large Duet, Applied Techniques: Two persons worked on any part of making the quilt. All applique, painting, embellishments, combination of techniques with piecing, etc. allowed, as well as entirely appliqued quilts, whole cloth quilts and those quilts without batting such as crazy quilts, wool quilts and cathedral windows.

**1300- Group Quilts:** Quilts that have been made and/or quilted by **THREE OR MORE** persons. All sizes, all techniques.

**1400- Miniature:** Quilts will have all aspects of the quilt reduced in scale from a full-sized quilt. Maximum size is 24" x 24". All techniques, all makers.

**1500- Modern**: Quilt must reflect some of the following characteristics: Asymmetry of design, improvisational piecing, bold colors, on-trend color combinations, and graphic prints, use of negative space, unconventional block structures, or reinterpreted traditional blocks. Quilting designs should reiterate modern theme. All sizes, techniques, and makers allowed.

**WALL Quilts-** Categories may be tweaked to balance numbers of entries. Artist Statement required.

**1610 - Wall Small**- Quilts will be under 35" wide. Patterns and kits allowed.

**1620 - Wall Medium-** Quilts will be 35" or more in width but less than 55" wide. Patterns and kits allowed.

**1630 - Wall Large-** Quilts will be 55" or more in width. Patterns and kits allowed.

**1640 - ART** Any size. MUST be completely original design. **Absolutely no patterns or kits allowed.** 

**1700-Found and Finished:** Quilts will include all sizes, all techniques. Quilts will have been started by another quilter (known or unknown) and finished by entrant(s).

**1800-3-D:** Category will include all three-dimensional projects to include such items as tuffets, dolls and more. Use your imagination. Must be able to be easily moved and displayed without issues. Need not be quilted, but may include quilted pieces. All techniques, all makers.

**Wearables:** Items do not need to be quilted. All techniques, all makers.

**1910-Garments:** Articles of clothing (vests, jackets, etc.) Pattern/designer required on entry form.

**1920- Bags/Purses/Accessories** Pattern/designer required on entry form.

**2000- Miscellaneous**: Any entry that does not fit into any other category and items such as household items. Examples: table runners, placemats, etc. All techniques, all makers.

**2100-MVQG 2020 and 2022 Quilt Show Challenges**: Traditional, modern, or art techniques can be employed. No size requirement for 2020 Challenge (Buns on the Beach). 20 x 20 finished size requirement for 2022 Challenge (Black & White Plus One). 2022 Challenge requires using assigned color in addition to black and white. 2022 block may be finished or left as an unfinished block. If unfinished, the block will be donated to MVQG after the show for use by the Charity Group.

**2200-All Other Challenges:** All challenge quilts **made after August 2018.** Any challenge quilt other than the 2020 and 2022 Quilt Show
Challenge quilts may be entered in this category. For example, a
challenge from a guild other than MVQG, any sit & sew group (whether
an MVQG sanctioned group or not), or a nationally sponsored challenge.
All techniques, all makers, all sizes.

**2300- Junior:** Entrant must be under the age of 18 and be a child/grandchild of a member. Each entry will receive a participation ribbon. (**Non-judged category**)
