1pm Get Your Stash Together: Organization for Quilters

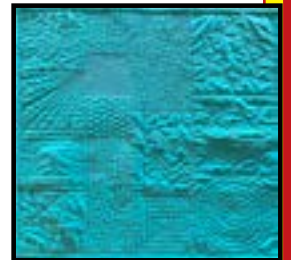
This lecture provides many practical ideas for making your fabric, tools, thread, books, and magazines readily accessible. Topics include how to fold and store fabric so that it's easy to view and locate, labeling, using your computer as a tool, and many ideas for actually using your stash.

7pm Machine Quilting With Metallic Thread

This lecture includes information about metallic threads and how to successfully use them for walking foot quilting, free motion quilting, bobbin quilting, and machine embroidery. Many projects stitched with metallic thread will be shown. Attendees will receive a list of tips for quilting with metallic threads.

NOVEMBER 5 Class 9:00-3:30 pm Walk All The Way Around The Block

The class will include straight line quilting, stitching in the ditch, how to stitch straight lines without marking your quilt, quilting with curved lines, circular spiral quilting, quilting with special stitches on your machine, and quilting curved designs using easy-to-make templates. Additional techniques include joining lines of stitching invisibly (for those times when your bobbin has run out or you've needed to remove stitches), matchstick quilting, radiating lines, square spirals, echoed curves, using freezer paper to get the border design just right, and using your piecing design for quilting grid designs with little or no marking.



NOVEMBER 6 Class 9:00-3:30 pm Little Gifts By the Dozen

Try a variety of fusibles and stabilizers while you learn to make a dozen lovely little gifts that you can easily make in quantity. Projects include a luggage tag, pencil case, padded glasses case, covered notebook, wristlet key chain, card case, pocket tissue holder, gift bag, potholder, bordered towel, napkin with a mitered hem, and a hair bow.

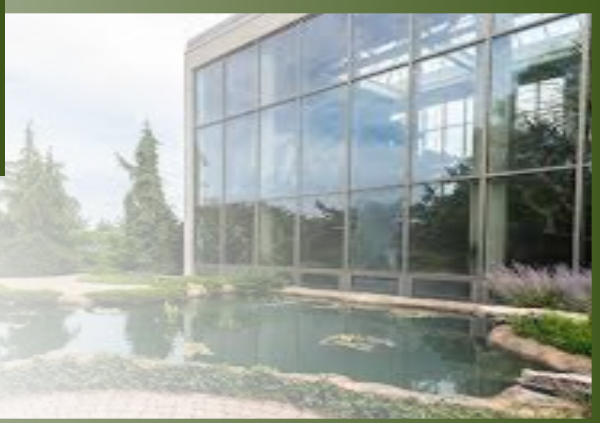

Their shop is in Northfield, MN. Their booth was wonderful! On the wall was Little Pink Stars, the quilt I used for my Little Pink Star II. It won 1st place in the Hand Quilted category at our guild show. Then, underneath, there were piles of Double Pink fabrics. I didn't buy any since I have so many.

What caught my eye was the bright and beautiful Turkey Red.



I don't know what I'll do with it. My great-grandmother made my grandmother's wedding quilt. (Some year, when I figure out how to get pictures from outer space, I'll show you.)

Volunteer Spotlight

Deb was born in Foreston, IL, grew up in Dixon, and after marrying her husband, Jeff, lived in Fulton, IL, and Clinton, IA, before settling in the Quad Cities in 1989. An only child herself, Deb is the mom of two adult sons, Joe and Adam—who, along with Jeff, often help with the quilt guild's heavy lifting.

A former high school Spanish teacher in Goose Lake, Iowa, Deb found her most fulfilling role as a stay-at-home mom. She loves music and musical theater, enjoys playing the piano, and is a member of her church's handbell choir. Animals hold a special place in her heart, especially labradoodles and any pet in need of rescue.

Although Deb attempted simple quilts earlier with cardboard templates, she became a serious quilter in 2005 when her neighbor, Kim Blake, encouraged her to join the quilt guild. She was hesitant, since earlier classes for garment sewing were less than successful. After joining the guild, she took a beginning quilting class with Donna Lanman and Bev Hoy. This gave her confidence, but the project still isn't finished! She's still trying to master flying geese. She started going to Quilt Queens Sit & Sew, where members were willing to answer questions and provide a support system for beginners. She loves piecing the traditional quilts.

Deb has sewn for Quilts of Valor and our Charity group since she joined. With Donna Lanman's encouragement, she tried new techniques in charity quilts. Now she says she has "the best job ever"—delivering quilts to the many organizations the guild supports. Deb has served on the nominating committee and co-chaired the raffle basket committee for three quilt shows.

Sally's quilting journey began at age 10, hand quilting with her grandmother. Her earliest project was made 45 years ago as a wedding gift for her brother. This was eventually followed by a baby quilt for her daughter. About 15–20 years ago, she began quilting seriously, building on the skills her grandmother passed down with cereal-box templates she kept for decades.

Sally enjoys art quilting the most and prefers piecing by machine.

Born in Rockford, IL, Sally has lived in several Midwest towns—including Macomb, Platteville, Dubuque, Hanover, and Pecatonica—before making her home here 24 years ago. She holds a sociology degree from Western Illinois University and a master's in industrial technology with a teaching certificate. Her career has included teaching at the University of Wisconsin–Platteville, working as an illustrator for the Defense Ammunition Center, and serving as an engineering technician for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers until 2012.

Sally and her husband, Joe, have been married for 48 years and have two daughters—Ella, 42, and Mara, 38. They are also grandparents to Etta, 4, and Alice, 1. Sally grew up with one sister and two brothers, and even inspired her sister to start quilting. At home, she shares her space with two cats, Tinker and Bell.

Sally has shared her talents in countless ways—serving as Guild workshop chair, newsletter proofreader, Fiber Arts planning committee member, charity quilt maker, and doll quilt contributor. She's conducted Fiber Arts meetings, handled Fiber Arts email reminders for 10 years, worked with the appraiser at our 2022 quilt show, and worked with Second Hand Treasures and Community Ed in 2024.
