**February 5: Charity Sew-In**. Come to Guild prepared and ready to work on charity quilts, sewing the seeds of generosity within the community. The Charity Quilt Group has chosen the disappearing 9-patch for charity quilts of various sizes -- Baby 36" X 40", Twin 63" X 87", Double 80" X 95", Adult day care 55" X 65." This pattern is a simple sew and adaptable to the various size requirements.

This is a perfect opportunity for you to rid your stash of leftover 5" squares and partial charm packs that have no purpose. If you don't have stash to share, the committee will provide 5" squares; however, we need fabrics that read neutral. You can construct your 9-patch blocks ahead of time and then split them at the sew-in according to the instructions provided by the committee. The Charity Committee will display a finished quilt at the meeting and provide a sample block for each table.

If you have a group that sews together you may divide responsibilities for supplying the equipment your group will need. The Charity Committee will have a supply of 5" blocks to mix and match, two irons and boards for ironing stations, and cutting mats and rotary cutters for two cutting stations. All you need to fulfill this community need is charity in your heart, and a sewing machine to piece these pieces of art together. Design elements allowed. **March 5:** A regional speaker from Iowa, Becky Wright, will present two different trunk show/lectures on Civil War Quilts. In the afternoon she'll focus on "The Importance of Quilts and Textiles during the Civil War" and in the evening her topic is "Christian Stafflinger: The Story of a Soldier and His Quilt."

**April 2:** Rita Lynn from Almost Heaven Designs in Colorado, will present two different trunk show/lectures for our Guild meetings in April -- "Follow the Path, Even if You Feel Lost," in the afternoon and "Quick Techniques for Art Quilts" in the evening.

Rita will teach two classes during her time with our Guild:

Sunday March 31 (9 to 3) – "Crazy Quilt Vessel: In this class, Rita will teach us how to make a 4-sided crazy quilt fabric vessel. FYI, Rita taught multiple sections of this class in Houston and, even so, there was a waiting list! The Kit fee is \$30.00 and it includes all the fabric, pattern, stabilizer and a mixture of embellishments that you'll need to complete your project.

Monday, April 1 (9 to 3) - "3-Dimensional Garden Variety": Rita will be creating a custom design that uses the Monet-style background from her "Monet in Yellow" pattern and expands the design by incorporating more than a dozen dimensional floral designs. The kit (\$25) will include all the materials to make all the flowers - fusible and some embellishments.

Sign-up for these classes will begin in February.

### **Directions for Charity Sew-Ins**

Instructions are simple. We start with a variety of 5" squares. Use of the imagination is desired. You can use (1) 9 - 5" squares of coordinates, or (2) 4 neutrals and 5 like or varied fabrics, normally the center is a darker fabric.

Sew three rows of three 5" squares. 1/4" seams

press both seams of the center row to the inside

press both seams of the outer rows to the outside

sew the rows together nesting the seams

sew row one outer block to row two center row then row two center to row three outside.

press the completed block

cut the 9 patch in half both directions

now play with your creation, imagine a multitude of patterns and arrange and resew the blocks to form a new pattern.

Patterns can be formed in a similar 9 patch configuration, just turn two opposite corner blocks two turns, if you wish to keep your original block together or you may sew a variety of the 7" blocks in rows, If you use the same block for the center in all of the block it will coordinate the completed project. We are dealing mostly with leftovers so that might not be an option unless you have a fabric you wish to bring that could be used for the centers of all the blocks.
