President's Message

The Fiber Arts group was a vision of a group quilters who wanted to expand into the art quilt techniques. There were approximately 12 people, led by Colleen Curry, who were the first to attend the group on a consistent basis 10 years ago. It has grown to a regular attendance of approximately 30. They welcome any fiber media, including fabric, thread, yarn, paper, wood, beads, roving, etc. and the techniques that can incorporate them into an art quilt, including weaving, embellishments, knitting, felting, spinning, reed, wirework and clay for embellishments and 3-D, dying or painting fabrics, and soooo many additional things that can be done.

Fiber art is defined on Wikipedia as: "Fiber art refers to fine art whose material consists of natural or synthetic fiber and

June 4: Idaho quilter, Sandy Turner, is a National Quilt Association Certified Teacher who was selected as the NQA Certified Teacher of the year in 2004. Her quilting niche is combining pictorial fabrics – for example, large prints, landscape prints, or floral prints – with traditional quilt patterns. In addition to her presentations at our Guild meetings, Sandy will teach two classes – Birds in the Air (Note: a Sunday class for those of you who have a traditional work week) and Attic Window from a Different Perspective



(on the Monday prior to the June Guild meeting). To ensure that fabric will work for the Attic Windows design, Sandy says to stand about 10 feet away from the fabric. If you can still see the details, the print will

work. Sign up for Sandy's classes is now available. The class registration

fee for each class is \$35.



The cost of the template for Attic Windows is \$35; however, Sandy indicates she will also bring templates that you can borrow to use during the class. Both classes will be held at the Kaaba Shriners Building - 511 Veterans Memorial Parkway in Davenport. Lunch will be available on site for \$5.


