

# How to make and attach a HANGING SLEEVE for quilts.

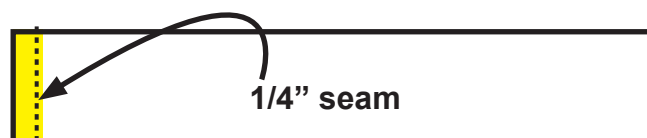
**WRONG side  
of fabric**

**RIGHT side  
of fabric**

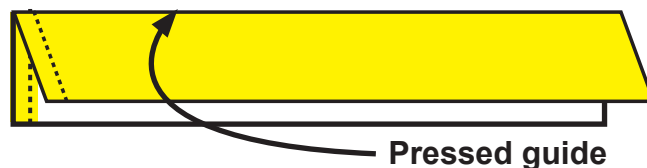
Cut fabric into 9" strips.  
Sew them together end to end for the length the  
width of your quilt.

**9" X WIDTH OF QUILT**

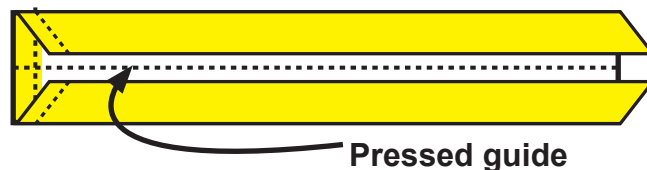
Fold the 9" ends under 1/4" twice to hem each end.



Fold the sleeve length wise to find and mark your  
center. Fold wrong sides together with lengthwise  
raw edges together and pres with iron.



Open and refold raw edges to the center fold mark  
that you just made.



Sew a 1/4" seam wrong sides together the length  
of the sleeve. \*\*\*Back stitch both ends to secure.



Press the seam open to one side without pressing  
over previous pressed guides. The sleeve will now  
have a convex opening for hanging.



**Pin sleeve along pressed edges to back of the quilt about 1/2" from the top of the quilt.  
Hand sew the top and bottom of the sleeve to the quilt backing. Do not stitch through the front.**

**On large quilts, the hanging sleeve must be placed so the bottom  
of the sleeve is 90" from the bottom of the quilt.  
Failure to properly place the sleeve could result in the quilt touching the floor.**
