Tickets are \$1.00 and monthly prizes are determined by the number of tickets sold the previous month. The winning ticket will be drawn at the end of the evening meeting.

September 3: The program will feature your entries to the 2019 Mississippi Valley Quilt Guild Challenge – Chocolate and Wine.

October 1: Our featured speaker, Linda Halpin, will present two trunk shows: "Borders on Parade" at the afternoon meeting and " 1×1 : Quilts Using 1×1 Half Square Triangles" in the evening.

Linda will teach two classes for our Guild, Prairie Lilies and Mexican Cross. There are still a few spaces available. 10/2: Prairie Lilies: Applique combines with piecing in this one day workshop. Joyous colors combine to create Prairie Lilies, constructed in her two-for-one technique. Piecing in this method creates cutaways that are ready to go into a <u>bonus</u> quilt, so you are actually making two quilts at the same time. Make use of every bit of fabric. It is such fun! Students start with how to choose and combine fabrics for a quilt, giving valuable fabric selection skills that can apply to your future quilt-making. This is followed with Halpin's two-for-one

piecing method, then adorn with applique, utilizing a very nifty stem technique. In addition to the Prairie Lilies quilt, students will also be making a bonus quilt out of the cutaways.

10/3: Mexican Cross: Cheery colors pop in this fun version of Mexican Cross. Not only is it a great pattern for using up lots of different fabrics in one quilt, but the construction technique cleverly creates a bonus quilt out of the cutaways. This complex looking pattern is a snap when you make it with Halpin's shortcut techniques.



Both classes will be held at the Kaaba Shriners Building - 511 Veterans Memorial Parkway in Davenport. Lunch will be available on site for \$5.

November 5: The program at our November meeting will feature a panel of Long-Arm Quilters coordinated by Terre Klipsch discussing "Everything You Wanted To Know From Your Longarmer, but were Afraid to Ask."



The Quilt Show Challenge for 2020 is "Buns at the Beach." Brush up on your Mary Lou Wediman skills, check out "Beach Bums" by JoAnn Hoffman, design your own buns, those of your child, grandchild, dog, cat, ... Too shy for backside buns? How about hamburger and/or hot dog buns??? Use your imagination!! Any size, any design, whatever reminds you of any kind of bun at the Beach! Let's have some fun in the sun!!!

QUILT SHOW RULES

Only members of the MVQG can enter a quilt in the Quilt Show, judging is optional.

To enter a quilt the entrant must be a member in good standing of the MVQG the year of the show and the previous year (due to registration deadlines).

To enter a quilt in the show, the entrant must have participated in the construction of the quilt, e.g. piecing, applique, or quilting.

In a duet category, only members will be eligible to receive a ribbon.

Winners in a non-duet category receive one category ribbon.

Special exhibits, e.g. gravel road, river, QOV, not judged but entered under one member's name can include quilts from non-members. The quilt show committee will determine what special exhibits will be included in each show.



As the president, it is my responsibility to find chairs for committees and help find people interested in filling those committees. It is that time of year to find those chairs.

I am looking for three committee chairs at this time

The first one is Community Education. This is a great committee to meet members and learn what their favorite quilting style is. I am looking for 2 co-chairs to run this committee. One co-chair would be working with venues to do demonstrations, signing up demonstrators, setting up at the venue and overseeing it. The demonstrations would be in places such as Freighthouse Farmers Market, Mississippi Valley Fair, libraries, the Butterworth Center, Botanical Center for Art in the Garden in the summer, and other venues that are possibilities. Looking for new ones too.

The second committee education co-chair would work with venues to show our pieces to the public, sign up people with pieces they are willing to share for a period of time, set up the displays, and oversee the time frames that need our participation. The hope is in places such as libraries, the River Arts Center in Clinton, galleries, and other venues that are available. Looking for new ones as well. This would not include the Figge display during National Quilt Day week or the Botanical Center display in the fall.

I would like 6-8 people on the committee under these 2 co-chairs so that there would be 3-4 to help each co-chair. If there are enough on the committee, no one will be overworked.

The Travel Committee is the next committee I am looking for a chair and at least 2 people to help. This committee is responsible for finding interesting places for a bus trip. Typically, our members only want a one-day trip, but longer can be looked at. Trips are usually to national quilt shows. New ideas are always welcome. The committee would be needed to book the bus, get tickets for the destination, find a location for a meal or two and handle sign-ups.

If you are interested in helping with either of these committees or one of the other ones listed in the directory on page 7, please let me know. Anyone can serve on a committee. For the chair positions, you must have been a member for 1 year.

For those not familiar with the MVQG Retreat, retreats are held twice a year, in the spring and the fall.

At retreat you can do anything you want: sleep in, stay up all night, go on road trips with your friends, work on your own projects, read books, or walk the beautiful camp grounds. We do our own cooking so everyone is assigned to a team to help with one meal. Most of all, Retreat is FUN! Price is \$25 per night for those retreaters staying at the camp overnight for a maximum of \$100 for the entire Wednesday thru Sunday retreat. The daytime only fee is \$17 per day for retreaters not staying overnight. You may register for all nights or all days only or any combination of nights and days. Prices include meals. 1700-Found and Finished

1800-3-Dimensional

2100, 2200- All Challenges

ALL OTHER CATEGORIES ARE ELIGIBLE FOR BEST OF SHOW.

DEFINITIONS:

Small Bed Quilt: Lap to Full (up to 80" wide and proportionate in length)

Large Bed Quilt: Queen to King (over 80" wide and proportionate in length)

Solo: Constructed, stitched, and quilted by ONLY ONE PERSON.

Duet: Constructed, stitched, and quilted by TWO PERSONS.

Group: Constructed, stitched, and quilted by THREE OR MORE PERSONS

<u>Pieced</u>: Pieced by hand or machine. No other techniques (no embellishments, no applique, etc.) allowed.

All Hand Done: Self-explanatory; only the binding stitched on by machine is allowed.

<u>Applied Techniques</u>: Any technique 'applied to the fabric' = Applique, painting, beading, crystals, etc., or any combination of these techniques with piecing is allowed.

Traditional: Pieces utilizing a traditional pieced/applique setting and/or pattern

<u>Art</u>: Original design pieces—no patterns or kits allowed.

<u>Modern</u>: May be pattern or kit. Must utilize 'modern' style in piecing and quilting design.

<u>Wall Quilts</u>: Designed to hang as art on a wall. These are quilted pieces that are NOT SUITED for use on a bed, crib, or sofa. These will not be bed quilts of any size that were made to be displayed on a wall. Wall Quilts will be required to include a <u>short</u> (25 word) artist's statement listing the name of the designer and all techniques/methods used. (This should not include where/why the fabric was purchased, please.) Statements <u>may</u> be read aloud for the consideration of the judge. Category sizes may be adjusted as needed by committee.

Categories for 2020 Great River Quilt Show

1100- All Hand Made: Must be made entirely by hand with no machine sewing/quilting other than sewing the binding to the front of the quilt. All sizes, techniques, makers allowed.

Small Bed Quilts: Used on a bed or crib; up to (and including) 80" wide and proportional in length.

1110- Small Solo, Pieced: One person made top and quilted it. Only piecing allowed, no applique or embellishments of any kind will be allowed.

1120- Small Solo, **Applied Techniques**: One person made top and quilted it. All applique, painting, embellishments, combination of techniques with piecing, etc. allowed, as well as entirely appliqued quilts, whole cloth quilts and those quilts without batting such as crazy quilts, wool quilts and cathedral windows.

1130- Small Duet, **Pieced**: Two persons worked on any part of making the quilt. **Only** piecing allowed, no applique or embellishments of any kind will be allowed.

1140- Small Duet, Applied Techniques: Two persons worked on any part of making the quilt. All applique, painting, embellishments, combination of techniques with piecing, etc. allowed, as well as entirely appliqued quilts, whole cloth quilts and those quilts without batting such as crazy quilts, wool quilts and cathedral windows.

Large Bed Quilts: Used on a bed; wider than 80" and proportional in length.

1210- Large Solo, Pieced: One person made top and quilted it. Only piecing allowed, no applique or embellishments of any kind will be allowed.

1220- Large Solo, **Applied Techniques:** One person made top and quilted it. All applique, painting, embellishments, combination of techniques with piecing, etc. allowed, as well as entirely appliqued quilts, whole cloth quilts and those quilts without batting such as crazy quilts, wool quilts and cathedral windows.

1230- Large Duet, **Pieced**: Two persons worked on any part of making the quilt. **Only** piecing allowed, no applique or embellishments of any kind will be allowed.

1240- Large Duet, Applied Techniques: Two persons worked on any part of making the quilt. All applique, painting, embellishments, combination of techniques with piecing, etc. allowed, as well as entirely appliqued quilts, whole cloth quilts and those quilts without batting such as crazy quilts, wool quilts and cathedral windows.

1300- Group Bed Quilts: Quilts that have been made and/or quilted by MORE THAN TWO persons. All sizes, all techniques.

1400- Miniature: Quilts will have all aspects of the quilt reduced in scale from a full-sized quilt. Maximum size is 24" x 24". All techniques, all makers.

1500- Modern: Quilt must reflect some of the following characteristics: Asymmetry of design, improvisational piecing, bold colors, on-trend color combinations, and graphic prints, use of negative

WALL Quilts- Categories may be tweaked to balance numbers of entries.

1610-Wall Small- Quilts will be under 35" wide.

A. Traditional: Traditional pieced/applique setting, patterns and kits allowed.

B. Art: Must be original design; no commercial patterns or kits allowed

1620-Wall Medium- Quilts will be 35" or more in width but less than 55" wide.

A. Traditional: Traditional pieced/applique setting, patterns and kits allowed.

B. Art: Must be original design; no commercial patterns or kits allowed.

1630- Wall Large- Quilts will be 55" or more in width.

A. Traditional: Traditional pieced/applique setting, patterns and kits allowed.

B. Art: Must be original design; no commercial patterns or kits allowed.

1700-Found and Finished: Quilts will include all sizes, all techniques. Quilts will have been started by another quilter (known or unknown) and finished by entrant(s).

1800-3-D: Category will include all three-dimensional projects to include such items as tuffets, dolls and more. Use your imagination. Must be able to be easily moved and displayed without issues. Need not be quilted, but may include quilted pieces. All techniques, all makers.

Wearables: Items do not need to be quilted. All techniques, all makers.

1910-Garments: Articles of clothing (vests, jackets, etc.) Pattern designer required on entry form

1920- Bags/Purses/Accessories

2000- Miscellaneous: Any entry that does not fit into any other category and items such as household items. Examples: table runners, placemats, etc. All techniques, all makers.

2100-MVQG Quilt Show Challenge: All techniques. No size requirement. Traditional, modern, or art techniques can be employed. Quilt must tie into any one, two or three aspects of the theme.

2200-All Other Challenges: All challenge quilts **made after August 2018.** Any guild/sit and sew group. Entrant must be member of MVQG at time of entry. All techniques, all makers, all sizes.

2300- Junior: Entrant must be under the age of 18 and be a child/grandchild of a member. Each entry will receive a participation ribbon. Non-judged category.
