

How to Make a Quilt Hanging Sleeve

Step 1: Cut a strip of fabric 9" tall and the width of the finished quilt.

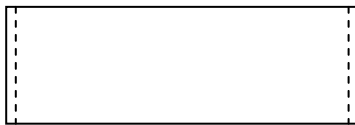
Step 2: On the short end, turn the fabric $\frac{1}{4}$ " twice to create a hem and stitch down.

Step 3: Fold the fabric in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press the crease firmly.

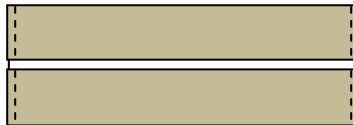
Step 4: Open the strip and with wrong side facing you, bring both long ends to the center crease you just created and press the new creases. These will be your locations for sewing your sleeve to your quilt. You now have three creases that you have pressed.

Step 5: Bring the long unfinished edges (wrong sides together) and stitch a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. This creates the tube that you will sew to the back of the quilt. Do not turn the tube.

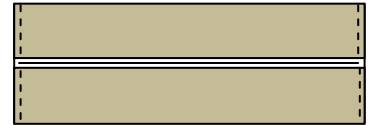
Note: If your quilt is longer than 90", you should attach the sleeve so it does not hang longer than 90". We do not want the show attendees to step on your quilt.
