This lecture provides many practical ideas for making your fabric, tools, thread, books, and magazines readily accessible. Topics include how to fold and store fabric so that it's easy to view and locate, labeling, using your computer as a tool, and many ideas for actually using your stash.

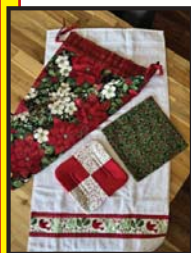
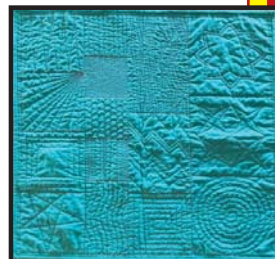
7pm Machine Quilting With Metallic Thread

This lecture includes information about metallic threads and how to successfully use them for walking foot quilting, free motion quilting, bobbin quilting, and machine embroidery. Many projects stitched with metallic thread will be shown. Attendees will receive a list of tips for quilting with metallic threads.

NOVEMBER 5 Class

Walk All The Way Around The Block

The class will include straight line quilting, stitching in the ditch, how to stitch straight lines without marking your quilt, quilting with curved lines, circular spiral quilting, quilting with special stitches on your machine, and quilting curved designs using easy-to-make templates. Additional techniques include joining lines of stitching invisibly (for those times when your bobbin has run out or you've needed to remove stitches), matchstick quilting, radiating lines, square spirals, echoed curves, using freezer paper to get the border design just right, and using your piecing design for quilting grid designs with little or no marking.



NOVEMBER 6 Class Little Gifts By the Dozen

Try a variety of fusibles and stabilizers while you learn to make a dozen lovely little gifts that you can easily make in quantity. Projects include a luggage tag, pencil case, padded glasses case, covered notebook, wristlet



key chain, card case, pocket tissue holder, gift bag, potholder, bordered towel, napkin with a mitered hem, and a hair bow.

Historical Interest

I've been getting ready for my workshop on Crazy Stitches and the lecture "Redwork and Friends" for Prairie Queen Quilt Club in Bishop Hill. As if I didn't already have embroidery books, I went to Amazon and got some more! There are a few I haven't figured out how to do, I just won't include them in the class.

Girls have been embroidering almost forever. The middle and upper class families sent the daughters to school to learn how. This proved that they could mark their linens and be a good house keeper. These antique samplers are now very expensive. The one pictured is on the low end.

If we jump to the 1870's or there about, the big thing was redwork. Growing up I used an Aunt Martha iron- on transfer and stitched a tea towel. That grew out of favor when designers had their patterns in newspapers and the quilt blocks printed had embroidery to add color to the quilt blocks.

OPPORTUNITY!!! You have a chance to help QOV &/or Charity committees. Sharon Milne shared an antique with me at the August meeting. It is a lovely Depression Era Double Wedding Ring. The circles are orange and the rings have a wide variety of fabric. It has been loved, some of the binding is frayed and some of the rings quite worn. My suggestion is to sell the quilt for \$20, half to QOV and half to Charity. Be the first one to give Sharon your Andrew Jackson!!!!
