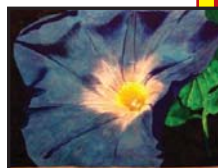

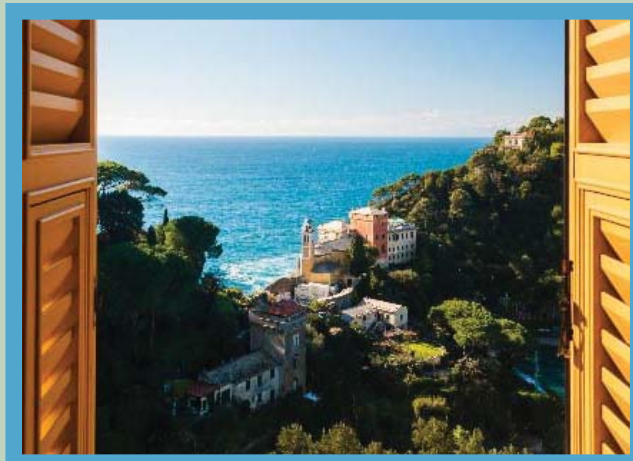

Historical Interest

A big thank you to the program committee for Janette's history programs. Our library has Patchwork Souvenir's. I have the copy, first one to ask for it can have it until August. Then, I think Janette mentioned, Hubert Ver Mehren. He's from Des Moines and is this year's Quilter's Hall of Fame honoree.

Hubert Ver Mehren had a significant impact on the quilt world of the 1930s.

Ver Mehren's patterns are considered some of the most complex and dramatic designs of their day, ranging from spectacular giant medallions to elegant embroideries. His distinctive aesthetic and his work represented the pinnacle of quilt design during this vibrant period in quilting history.

Ver Mehren's artistic vision challenged conventional design boundaries and influenced quilting trends of the era, even as the man himself remained in the shadows. Quilt historians consider his rediscovery so significant and what his work reveals about the evolution of American quilting.
