General Membership Guidelines:

Meetings of Lansing Woman's Club are held at 1:30 pm on Friday afternoons from the first Friday of October through the last Friday of April. Members are expected to attend Friday meetings, but they are not mandatory. Each member will co-host tea service once or twice a year and participate on a committee and/or serve on the board as needed.


