




Budget Reserve Balance




Debt Services Payments



As of June 2024 (as that is the last audit report I have) Cumberland Valley has a total of \$196,929,189.00 in long term debt (bonds). This was PRIOR to the \$90,000,000 we have used toward Eagle View and Green Ridge currently. We still have more to pay toward Eagle View and Green Ridge.... what is our debt payment going to be in 2026-27? This is why I keep suggesting we start living within our means. ('25 & '26 are budgeted amounts whereas the rest are from the actual audits from CV).




In 2020 CV's Superintendent's salary was \$185,400 now it is \$246,376; a **32.88%** increase. The Average teacher's salary in 2020 was \$63,632 and in the 2024-25 school year it was \$69,327, an 8.94% increase. The Average salary for a Superintendent in Pennsylvania is **\$159,154** (as of September 2025). (Numbers taken from https://www.openpagov.org/)


Cumberland Valley pays their teachers less (on average) and their administration more (on average).

Average Administrative salary and Teacher salary Cumberland County Schools


