FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHY IS THE CITY'S NEW VACATION RENTAL (STR) ORDINANCE UNFAIR?

- Passed by the City Council without allowing a public vote
- Promotes STRs throughout the City that can harm residential neighborhoods
- Provides unlimited Primary STRs and Home-Stay STRs in the Coastal Zone
- Reduces available housing and long-term rental properties and can raise costs, particularly affecting the lives of low income and minority residents
- Authorizes the City Council to increase the number of STRs at any time
- Favors extremely profitable STRs for investors by allowing grandfathering and renewal provisions that can inhibit residents' property rights
- No effective system to grant STR permits to limit exposing residents to partying, noise, traffic, trash, parking, cleaning services, smoking, code enforcement failures, etc.
- Jeopardizes the safe and peaceful enjoyment of your home
- Lacks effective enforcement protocols to prevent illegal STRs from operating
- Uses the difficult to enforce honor system to collect TOT owed the City

WHY IS THIS VOTER INITIATIVE NEEDED?

Because the City Council would not allow a public vote, an Initiative is the only way residents can vote for a Short-Term Vacation Rental Policy that protects our neighborhoods from the negative impacts associated with STRs. The City Council voted against allowing a vote.
