

Phuvi Green Foundation- a Charitable Trust (PGF) is a visionary trust established in June 2017 with the noble mission of empowering financially backward and rural-based students to pursue quality education and achieve career excellence.

The foundation was initiated by Mr. Karthikeyan along with his friends during their undergraduate studies. In its early days, a unit called the Solid and Liquid Resource Management Team (SLRMT) was formed at MTN College, a small team dedicated to campus-level waste management and environmental awareness. This team included Mr. Prasanna, Mr. Arunpandi, Mr. K.G. Ramesh, Mr. Santhanakaruppu, and Mr. Arivanantham, led by Mr. Karthikeyan himself.

Our Mission



Bridging Gaps Through Educational Reforms

India's journey toward universal education is both inspiring and complex. With over 250 million school-age children, the country faces the enormous challenge of ensuring that every child regardless of caste, class, gender, or geography has access to quality education. For underprivileged children, education is not just a right; it is a pathway out of poverty and marginalization. Over the past two decades, the Government of India has launched a series of ambitious initiatives to make education inclusive, equitable, and transformative. In this edition, we explore the major national schemes that are reshaping the educational landscape for underprivileged children across the country.

Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA)

A flagship program integrating Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan, and Teacher Education.

Goal

Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education from pre-primary to senior secondary levels, especially for rural and disadvantaged children.

PM POSHAN (Mid-Day Meal Scheme)

Formerly known as the Mid-Day Meal Scheme, this initiative provides nutritious meals to school children in government and aided schools.

Goal

Improve nutritional status, increase school enrollment, and reduce dropouts among children from low-income families.

National Means-cum-Merit Scholarship Scheme (NMMSS)

Target

Class 9–12 students from economically weaker sections in government schools.

Benefit

Provides ₹12,000 per year to encourage students to continue their education beyond the secondary level.

Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya (KGBV)

Target

Girls belonging to SC, ST, OBC, and minority communities in rural areas.

Benefit

Residential schools providing quality education for girls from disadvantaged backgrounds.

Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao

Though focused on gender equality, it emphasizes education for the girl child.

Goal

Improve the child sex ratio, ensure girls' education, and empower them to achieve financial independence through learning.

Digital India e-Learning Initiatives

Programs like SWAYAM, DIKSHA, and PM eVidya provide free digital educational resources for school and college students.

Goal

Make quality learning content accessible to students across urban and rural India.

Skill India Mission / PM Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY)

Target

Youth and school dropouts from underprivileged backgrounds.

Goal

Provide skill-based training and employment opportunities to make them job-ready and self-reliant.

National Child Labour Project (NCLP)

Target

Children rescued from child labour.

Benefit

Provides bridge education, vocational training, and stipends to help them reintegrate into formal schooling.

Transformation through Scholarships - A real life story

An inspiring example of transformation through scholarships in Tamil Nadu is the story of Swega Saminathan, a 17-year-old girl from Kasipalayam village. Coming from a farming family with limited means, Swega earned a prestigious ₹3 crore scholarship to study at the University of Chicago. This scholarship covers all her expenses for four years, including tuition, accommodation, health insurance, books, and travel. Her success exemplifies how financial support from scholarships enables rural students to access world-class education, overcome economic hardships, and pursue dreams that were once unimaginable. Swega's achievement brings hope and motivation to many rural students in Tamil Nadu striving to achieve higher education and career success.
